PBF Program Coordinator Ms. Ndella Faya Colley presented this session.

The Peacebuilding Fund is the UN Secretary General's Fund launched in 2006 to support activities that "directly contribute to post-conflict stabilization and strengthen the capacities of governments, national/local institutions and transitional or other relevant authorities". It currently supports 120 projects in 25 countries by delivering fast, flexible and relevant funding. The Gambia became eligible to receive the PBF fund in 2017. PBF has committed \$20m for Gambia to support peacebuilding initiatives to promote peace for sustainable development.

She noted that support to the Gambia is informed by: Priorities in the National Development Plan (2018-2020) and UNDAF, UN Commitments of support to Gambia towards achieving Agenda 2030 and The Africa we want in 2063, UNSCRs on 'Sustaining Peace' and evidences of conflict drivers identified by the Conflict and Development Analysis (CDA, 2018, updated 2019) On PBF projects in the country, she noted that:

- In April 2017: 3.1 Million USD approved for 3 projects i.e. Security Sector Reforms OP/UNDP, Transitional Justice – Min. of Justice/UNDP and Support to Presidency – OP/UNDP.
- PBF Support in 2018 \$7.1m for 4 Projects i.e. a) Transitional Justice and Human Rights (Continuation with an added focus on HR) Ministry of Justice/UNDP/OHCHR & establishment of Peacebuilding Secretariat at OP/UN RCO, b) Addressing Conflicts Over Land and Natural Resources in The Gambia- Ministry of Lands/FAO/UNDP, c) Strengthening sustainable and holistic reintegration of returnees in The Gambia OVP/IOM/ITC/UNFPA, d) Increased Women and Youth Participation in Decision making process and as agents of community conflict prevention OVP/UNFPA/UNICEF.
- Support for 2019 Projects under development with US\$ 5.5 million allocated funding: Strengthening Rule of Law and Enhancing Justice and Security Service Delivery in The Gambia (UNDP, UNICEF & UNFPA), Support to strengthen inclusive citizen engagement for accountable governance in The Gambia (UNDP & UNICEF) & Strengthening community coping mechanisms to mitigate risks of conflicts and reduce climate related tensions in NBR, CRR and URR (WFP, UNFPA,ITC)

2020 PBF Governanc e & Leadership AWP Presentation of Recommendations from PBF & UNWAS for the Governance and leadership. The UNDP Governance Officer Yirah Mansaray presented this session.

Some of the comment that were incorporated in the draft proposal and final project document on strengthening inclusive citizen engagement for accountable governance in the Gambia includes:

- While the proposal plans to tackles some clearly identified peacebuilding issues and proposes appropriate interventions in different areas (exchange with leadership, work with political parties and work with civil society and media) to enhance accountability and transparency of institutions; It was suggested to restructure the results framework with outcome 1 focused on more effective exchange between the population and the leadership which then would subsume the activities of CSOs (as one output, currently as a separate outcome) and media (another output) for them to play the role as constructive and engaged representatives of communities/ channels to input into public policy.
- On Outcome 2 (political parties), Even though it was suggested that the proposed activities remain very relevant, the proposal to elicit the collaboration with UNOWAS and the DPPA regional desk especially around work within political parties was suggested. Invariably, all of these comments were taken on board reflecting the final outcomes, outputs, activities of the Implementing Partners as stated below:

Di sion and approval of the Plan

Reacting to the presentation, whilst the Inter- Party Committee representative commended the accurate reflections of their activities in the AWP, he requested sequencing during implementation. The ActionAid representative noted that the plan was silent on the administrative cost for implementing partners especially NGOs. Reacting, the UNDP DRR and Operation informed partners that proposal should be submitted with administrative cost. On his part, the representative of the CSO Anti-Corruption Coalition highlighted their aspirations of reviewing government authorities and examining public finances; and appealed for greater collaboration with the DSPD. The Director General of DSPD noted that a lot needs to be done to enable Government deliver on results, thus the need to scale up measures of accountability within government. He cautioned about the need to be innovative in addressing resistance to change or reforms.

Following the brief statement of the Director General Department of Strategy, Policy and delivery (DSPD) Office of the President, Alhagie Nyangado, he moved for the approval of the activities, workplan, which

was moved by the IPC representative and seconded by representative from ActionAid International-The Gambia
