The activities of this project will be incorporated with the yearly plans of the GRDB. The GRDB is looking forward to the implementation of the project.

GLDA

• It was noted that the GLDA has already integrated aspects of DRM in their work, such as in the areas of socio-economic aspects. It was noted that the incorporation of GIS technology in mapping areas to improve monitoring of DR is important e.g. drought prone areas.

CDC

• CDC noted the involvement of the Ministry of Communities (NDC) is crucial in Outcome 2 and 3.

Hydromet

- The Hydromet Service has collaborated with IICA on various initiatives. The information can be included under Synergy with other International Organisations in Guyana.
- Agro-meteorological unit especially needs specialised training by agro-metrological specialist under Output 2.1.

Fisheries Department

- Inland Subsistent fisherfolks are also farmers, the site selection should consider areas of integrated farming.
- Guidelines and manuals should be produced for each agency so that in case of disaster events, each agency take action on particular disaster event (under Activity 2.2.2)

NAREI
