#### Narrative

The Poverty Environment Initiative (PEI) Malawi programme is a component of the Environment and Natural Resources Management Programme Support Document to Malawi which highlights current and emerging ENRM issues reflected in MGDS II, UNDAF 2012-16 and UNDP CPD 2012-2016 (both of which have been extended to 2017) and outlines a strategy to deal with them and prioritized activities under four broad themes: Mainstreaming; Data, Information and Knowledge Management; Coordination and Capacity Development at national and district levels. In general, mainstreaming will be enhanced by support for the expeditious review, harmonisation and enactment of appropriate ENRM legislation and policies and the development of institutional mechanisms and plans at national, sector and district levels. Sufficient budget allocations for poverty-environment mainstreaming is essential and PEI will support mechanisms and reviews to enhance the budgeting and financing for sustainable development including the setting up of a Climate Change, Environment and Natural Resources Management Sector Wide Fund. To bolster Information and Knowledge Management support will be provided to civil society and the private sector for effective coordination and networking on P-E mainstreaming to influence national debate and policy making. Better donor and government coordination, through the support of an ENRM sector working group will lead to more effective and efficient decision-making. Human capacity will be enhanced by the provision of training at tertiary institutions.

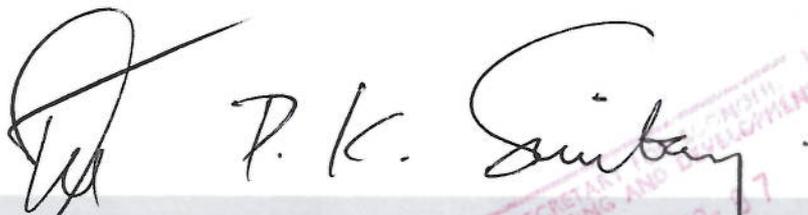
Activities in the current work plan build on the successes of the PEI from 2009-2013 to ensure that the products that were produced (around integration of ENRM in policy-making, planning, budgeting and communication) are institutionalised and operationalized. It will support the implementation of the ENRM Project Document for 2012-2016 (as the new one is being developed) so that policies, plans and budgets are embedded in overarching structures and continue to integrate aspects of poverty and environment. In particular, the Project will achieve the following results in 2017:

- i. Improved pro-poor environment and natural resources linkages mainstreaming in policies, development plans and programmes at national, sector and district level
- ii. Increased budgeting and financing for sustainable development in national, district and sector plans, policies and budgets
- iii. Collection of Data and knowledge on the poverty, environment and natural resources nexus and making them accessible to decision makers in government, private sector and civil society

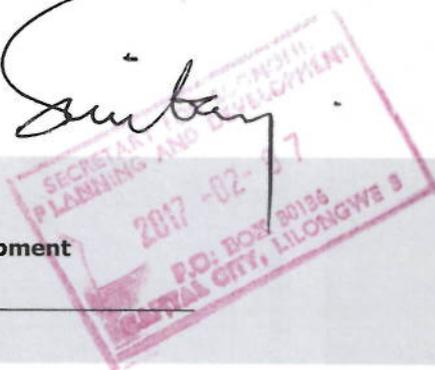

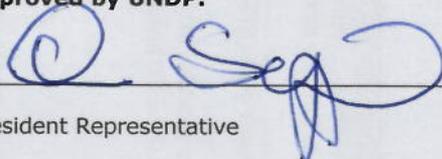
