**Brief Description of the Project**

The Afar Integrated Dryland Management Project (AIDMP) is a scale-up from the 'Mile Project' implemented during 2006-2008 in Afar National Region State (ANRS). The AIDMP aims to build the environmental management capacity at community/kebele and wereda levels based on the Afar Regional and the 5 pilot Woredas/Districts Climate Change Adaptation Programmes prepared through the participation of Regional, Woreda and Federal level stakeholders. The Adaptation Programme has identified vulnerability of the pastoral communities and their environment, the available adaptive capacity and possible response measures to be taken at different levels. The interventions identified in 5 woredas are the one included in AIDMP to be implemented to raise the climate change adaptation capacity of the grass root communities. The AIDMP also aims to contribute to building the regional Climate Resilient Green Economy (CREG) platform, which intrinsically linked to sustainable dry lands management, comprising of stakeholders from the Federal, Regional, Woreda, Civil Societies working in the Region and UN organizations in ANRS. The Regional and the Woreda Climate Change Adaptation Programme prepared are central to the AIDMP strategy: to assist Afar communities to strengthen their resilience to the challenges of land degradation and to maintain and diversify livelihoods in difficult environmental conditions that are increasingly exacerbated by changes in weather patterns and changes in Afar social fabric. UNDP provides USD 1,592,300, secured from the Government of Norway to support UNCCD implementation in the 5 Woredas, namely: Dewe, Mile,



Chiffra, Aura and Ewa. The project contributes to implementation of the sustainable development as set in the national 5 years Growth and Transformation Plan (GTP). The AIDMP is a project within the CPD, contributed to UNDAF cycle 2007-2012-2015, a priority has transcended over longer period of time, and contribute to the achievement of Ethiopia's vision set in the GTP (2010/11- 2014/15): "Building an economy which has a modern and productive agricultural sector with enhanced technology and an industrial sector that plays a leading role in the economy, sustaining economic development and securing social justice and increasing per capita income of the citizens to as to reach the level of those in middle-income countries."

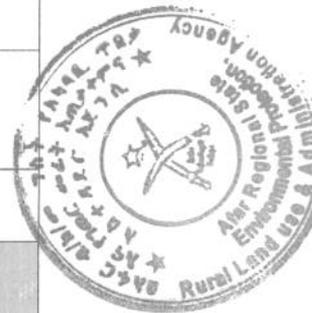
