Mozambique continues to face enormous challenges that call attention to the need for more effective support especially for planning, monitoring, evaluation and coordination. Efforts to implement and monitor policies and strategies are severely affected by limited capacities to promote civil society participation. Non-state actors such as Civil Society Organizations (CSO) are therefore an important resource in contributing for the achievement of National Development Goals. The Government is aware of the importance of citizen's participation and has created formal Forums where Civil Society, Private Sector and all other non-state actors are called to participate (Consultative Councils, Development Observatories and the APRM Forum).

In 2007 under the country programme 2007-2011, UNDP supported the Civil Society Index, a participatory selfassessment process of CSOs that culminated in a national seminar in December. This exercise continued in 2008 with the preparation of a pilot capacity building program for CSOs throughout the country that has been running

This Project will build on the experience and lessons learned from the implementation of the UNDP-supported CSO empowerment project and from the findings of the CSO index to continue to strengthen the capacity of CSOs to enable their effective participation in the governance processes and policy dialogue. In order to consolidate the process, the project will emphasize to strengthen CSO functionalities, specifically their management capacities much needed to formulate, implement, monitor and review policies and programmes. The project will also provide CSOs with the required analytical tools, techniques and resources to accompany and monitor Governance processes, and will work towards contributing to an enabling environment for their operation, including the legal

Women still continue to be vulnerable, have less access to education, less informed about their rights, last to participate in decision-making that affect their lives and the most infected by HIV-AIDS. In the Government Fiveyear Plan and in line with the SADC platform, the Government of Mozambique has adopted the objective to achieve full gender-parity in decision-making positions (50% women) by 2014, which means a 100% increase from the current situation (26%). This project will support vulnerable groups specifically women, to empower, promote cultural change, and eliminate discriminatory practices and stereotypes. The project will support initiatives that promote gender equality at all levels. HIV disproportionally affects women and girls, therefore the project under its output 4 will support the decentralization of information.
