Fund Flow Arrangements and Financial Management:

At the request of the Government of Tamilnadu, UNDP will directly release funds to the bank account created for the implementation of this project (bank details given below). The government of Tamilnadu will account for funds received from UNDP. The request from GoTN will come through the standard Fund Authorization and Certificate of Expenditures (FACE) Report duly signed by the Project Director or person assigned/delegated by GoTN.
