### **Brief Description**

The project is aimed at addressing technical, institutional and operational capacities to strategize and implement key budget priorities of the government including through the Development Support Services provision agreed in the CPAP 2013-17. The project will specifically make available (a) technical assistance to the SDG visioning and implementation at the state level; (b) analysis of budgets and implementation bottlenecks as a critical input to the proposal development and strategic implementation action plan; (c) demand-supply assessment and response generation; (d) technical assistance to design and develop large and scalable projects; (e) technical capacities to advice government on utilization of budget allocations; (f) innovative and cost effective solutions and scaling up; (g) strengthening concurrent monitoring mechanisms across key flagship programmes and schemes; and (h) experience sharing, knowledge and information management systems. These issues will be addressed through a set of activities outlined in the work plan at section-I below. Pertinent to mention here that the proposed work plan should be considered flexible in nature to also enable the CO to respond to the immediate and specific government requests as these come up. The project has co-contribution under the Fund for Country-Level Emerging Priority Initiatives (FCEPI) grant.
