Brief Description of Initiation Plan

The Government of Iran, with support from UNDP, requested GEF funding for a project entitled "Building a Multiple-Use Forest Management Framework to Conserve Biodiversity in the Caspian Forest Landscape". The project objective is to establish the necessary governance system and know-how for a landscape management approach to decision making and use of Caspian Forests which nests protected areas within a matrix of conservation-compatible land uses in order to maintain biodiversity, ecosystem functions and resilience. In this regard, three related components have been foreseen, namely: Component 1: National and local level policies and regulatory frameworks provide for optimized planning and management: Component 2: Institutional and individual capacities strengthened: Component 3: Strengthened community capacities will be designed to deliver the project objective.

The PPG phase of nine months would help to prepare the ground for the implementation of the full scale project. During this preparatory phase, a number of activities have been planned that are expected to engage stakeholders and will support activities that will inform the preparation of the full project document and CEO Endorsement Request for the Full-Size Project (FSP) "Building a Multiple-Use Forest Management Framework to Conserve Biodiversity in the Caspian Forest Landscape". This document will be submitted to the GEF following further information gathering and stakeholder consultations, and will be accompanied by co-financing letters in line with pledges made in the PIF. Specifically the following preparatory activities will be financed (for details refer PPG document submitted to GEF below):

B. PROPOSED PROJECT PREPARATION ACTIVITIES

Describe the PPG activities and justifications:

The PPG process will engage stakeholders and will support activities that will inform the preparation of the full project document and CEO Endorsement Request for the Full-Size Project (FSP) "Building a Multiple-Use Forest Management Framework to Conserve Biodiversity in the Caspian Forest Landscape". This document will be submitted to the GEF following further information gathering and stakeholder consultation, and will be accompanied by co-financing letters in line with pledges made in the PIF.

The PPG is requested to finance four preparatory activities. These will be co-funded and supported by the project partners.

Activity 1: Site profiling and detailed threat assessment

This activity will focus on carrying out a detailed review of available information related to the management of the Caspian forests to fully establish a comprehensive baseline. It will identify and provide information of different management areas within the landscape that will include forest types, areas of high biodiversity significance, areas requiring intervention, various production activities and their trajectory, review of current management arrangements and also identification of key stakeholders and their roles. Past and on-going programmes and projects related to forest planning and management will be analyzed for lessons to build on. In addition, the PPG funds will also support a detailed threats assessment building on existing studies and information. This information is expected to enable the selection of key areas within the Caspian forests for project interventions, determine gaps in knowledge so that the output "Sustainable Land Use Management Plan" of the FSP can be adequately scoped, detailed and costed. The relevant GEF 5 Tracking Tools namely the BD SO2 tracking tool will be completed once the areas for intervention and sectors have been determined. In addition, as the project is adopting a landscape approach and improving PA management is part of the outcome, the METT will be filled in for those PAs that the project will focus on.

Activity 2: Capacity Assessment for multiple-use forest management at systemic and institutional levels

The PPG will provide funds to conduct a comprehensive capacity assessment at the systematic and institutional levels

using the UNDP CD methodology and CD assessment scorecard to set the baseline and develop a capacity development response barrier and also analyze regulatory, technical and knowledge barriers to the institution and implementation of multiple-use forest management. The assessment is expected to generate information on the capacity of the relevant institutions for planning and management of multiple use forest management and capacities for protected area management including also capacity requirements to engage in participatory management approaches with the local communities ("central and district staff of FRWO and DoE trained and able to apply / oversee multiple use landscape level forest management"). This exercise will also be useful to ascertain partnerships and recommend institutional mechanisms for sustaining capacity development processes post-project. Information generated will also support detailing management arrangements for the project.

Activity 3: Assessment of community capacities for natural resource management and alternative livelihoods

The next set of activities relate to supporting analysis of socio-economic status of local communities and conduct extensive consultations with the local communities especially forest resident communities to ascertain their views, interests and capacities to engage in managing areas designated for community based management. Various alternative livelihood opportunities will be identified in discussion with the local communities. In addition, detailed market assessments and where possible value chain analysis and potential for development of natural resource based enterprises and exploration of existing community level institutions that can be utilized to for community enterprises will be carried out. This will help to a) define strategic interventions that can be implemented by the project to establish key alternative livelihoods for local communities that are feasible socially and economically; b) provide recommendations for incorporating the concerns of the local communities in the design of multiple use management governance frameworks including community forestry schemes. This activity is also expected to identify and foster partnerships with local NGOs and other civil society organizations that are working in improving livelihoods in the area. In addition, the PPG funds will support carrying out a targeted capacity assessment of local communities to engage in community forestry and participatory resource management approaches and help define strategic interventions to address gaps.

Activity 4: Feasibility Analysis and Budget

Based on the above analysis and detailed information the project strategy will be prepared. Key outputs under this activity include: (i) detailed project strategy, including incremental cost analysis, cost-effectiveness, and risks; (ii) detailed budget, and (iii) detailed monitoring and evaluation plan; iv) a sound replication strategy
