

**AMENDMENT No. 1 TO THE [UN TO UN TRANSFER AGREEMENT] BETWEEN THE UNITED NATIONS DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME (“UNDP”) AND THE INTERNATIONAL LABOUR ORGANIZATION (“ILO”)**

Reference is made to the UN TO UN TRANSFER AGREEMENT entered into on 16 December 2021 by and between the UNITED NATIONS DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME (“UNDP”), and INTERNATIONAL LABOUR ORGANIZATION (the “ILO”).

**WHEREAS** [UNDP] has requested and [ILO] has agreed to amend the Agreement by a forty-nine-day no-cost extension of the project’s duration, bringing the end of the implementation period from 12 August 2022 to 30 September 2022. The no cost-extension will allow UNDP and ILO to complete the remaining key project activities and document results achieved and lessons learned, which will inform UNDP’s future infrastructure rehabilitation programming toward creating inclusive and decent job opportunities.

**NOW THEREFORE**, the Parties agree:

(1). To extend the implementation period from 12 August 2022 to 30 September 2022 and revise the project deliverable timelines/reporting for the ILO as noted in the table below:
