#### I. QUARTERLY SUMMARY OF ACTIVITIES

During the first quarter, the project team continued to work on developing the Needs Assessment instrument, which is currently about 80% complete. A Technical Review Committee was established during the period, which conducted a thorough review of the instrument. The instrument is now being amended to incorporate the recommendations from the Committee. The amended instrument is expected to be ready for final review by the Project Board and Technical Review Committee in July 2011. The instrument will then be pre-tested in late August/early September before actual utilization in the field, which is expected to commence in September 2011. The assessment is expected to last through to end of November 2011.

Work is about 30% completed on the Desk Review/Secondary Data collection and the Research Design is about 50% completed and will be reviewed by Technical Review Committee by mid June, 2011.

During the first quarter a Public Sector consultations workshop was held [February 15th and 16th] at The Wyndham Kingston Hotel. This 2-day workshop was attended by 192 participants mainly from MDAs and the UN country team.

A project website was also established during the quarter as part of the advocacy component of the project.
