Brief Description

Jamaica Acceded to the Vienna Convention for the Protection of the Ozone Layer and the Montreal Protocol on Substances that Deplete the Ozone Layer, and its London Amendment on 31 March 1993. The country subsequently acceded to the Copenhagen Amendment on 6 November 1997, and the Montreal and Beijing Amendments on 24 September 2003. Jamaica is classified as an Article 5 country under the Protocol.

Jamaica completely phased out the consumption of Annex A, Group 1 Chlorofluorocarbons (CFCs) in 2006 and has commenced the process of phasing out consumption of Annex C, Group 1 Hydro-chlorofluorocarbons (HCFCs) through implementation of the HCFC phase out management plan (HPMP).

The HPMP will enable Jamaica to meet all of the Montreal Protocol's HCFC control targets. The HPMP's overarching strategy is based on the following key interventions:

- a) Capacity-building for refrigeration technicians
- b) Distribution of basic service tools, recovery/recycling equipment and retrofit kits
- c) Converting the HCFC-141b-based foam manufacturing enterprise to use methyl formate (non-HCFC technology)
- d) Extending the regulatory framework to monitor and control trade in HCFC and equipment containing same;
- e) Monitoring and Evaluation

This first tranche implementation project will enable Jamaica to meet the following reduction targets:
