I. QUARTERLY SUMMARY OF ACTIVITIES

During the Fourth Quarter the recruitment process for the 7 consultancies, for which the Justice Reform Implementation Unit (JRIU) is primarily responsible, continued. Suitably qualified candidates were found for 4 consultancies; while no suitable candidates were identified for the remaining 3 consultancies. The JRIU made the decision to utilize the limited tender process, the assistance of the United Nations Development Programme, as well as re-advertise on the Ministry of Justice Website.

By the end of the First Quarter of 2013, the JRIU is expecting to identify a suitably qualified consultant to develop the Communications Strategy and the Review of the Automatic Mediation System in Jamaica and Make Recommendations for Improving the System. Therefore, barring any unforeseen delays, these consultancies should be completed by the end of the Second Quarter of 2013. The JRIU has experienced difficulty identifying candidates to invite to participate in the Limited Tender process for the Development of the Citizen's Scorecard and the Development of the Monitoring and Evaluation Mechanism for the Justice Reform Programme. This difficulty may delay the achievement of these targets until the end of the Third Quarter of 2013.

Regarding the 3 consultancies for which a suitably qualified consultant was identified, the consultancies were approved by the Ministry of Justice Procurement Committee, and negotiations with the candidate completed. It is expected that the contracts will be signed in the First Quarter of 2013.

During the reporting period the Justice Reform Implementation Unit continued to support the Department of Justice Canada to execute its reform activities through the provision of documentation and logistical support for missions by the Department to Jamaica.

Activities which were moved from the Third Quarter to the Fourth Quarter in order to facilitate the Office of the Director of Public Prosecutions were still not accomplished, as despite indications from the Director of Public Prosecutions, the Department was still not able to accommodate the activities under the JUST. The ODPP is not expected to be able to accommodate the JUST until the First Quarter of 2013.

There is a lack of clarity regarding the Social Order Component for the JUST programme, specifically how it fits into the overall structure of the Ministry of Justice and the Justice Sector Reform Programme. The Social Order Component has been active for approximately four months, however there has been no report on progress made on that side of the programme. There is a lack of clarity regarding the operations of that component. The current lack of clarity regarding reporting relationships means that an action item to address the issue is difficult to formulate at this time. The JRIU has encountered significant challenges securing suitably qualified consultants to execute 4 of the planned consultancies for 2012. Regarding the 4 consultancies for which no consultants were identified during the initial evaluation process; 2 have been retendered using the Limited Tender process as greater than 3 possible candidates were identified, as required by the Government of Jamaica Procurement Guidelines. However, 2 consultancies have not been re-tendered as the GoJ procurement requirement of identifying at least 3 possible candidates has not been met. The JRIU will continue to look for suitably qualified

The work plan of the JRIU is heavily dependent upon the work being done by the Department of Justice, Canada (DOJ) as a number of the JRIU's work plan activities are intended to give support to the Department of Canada. If DOJ does not execute tasks on time, or provide the JRIU with a work plan ahead of time the JRIU will not be able to plan effectively or execute work plan tasks on time. Up to the preparation of this report a draft 2013 work plan has not been received from the Department of Justice, Canada. This presents a significant challenge to the JRIU achieving tasks on schedule.
