I. SUMMARY OF PROGRESS TOWARDS OUTPUTS (DESCRIBE PROJECT PROGRESS OUTPUT, CHALLENGES AND OTHER MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS DURING THE QUARTER)

The major achievement for the Project for the period are outlined below:

Output 1 – There has been minimal progress towards the achievement of this output. The low delivery has been attributed to late submission of deliverables; low technical quality of reports and lack of stakeholders' consultations. Faciliated two (2) meetings of the multi-sectoral/stakeholder NBSAP Technical Working Group (TWG), on April 15, 2015 and June 18, 2015 respectively. In the first meeting there was comprehensive discussions on the three 1st drafts of deliverables (*Gap analysis and lessons learned document on the implementation of the first NBSAP; Report outlining the Biodiversity stocktaking, review process and stakeholder consultation process; including social media strategy) from the Biodiversity Specialist (BS); while in the second meeting the TWG reviewed and finalized the 2nd draft of the <i>NBSAP Communication Strategy and agreed on the outline for the 2011-2020 NBSAP.* The Biodiversity Specialist also submitted a 2nd draft of the *Gap analysis and lessons learned document on the implementation of the first NBSAP and*

a draft of the supplemental Stocktaking Questionnaire. The International Advisor has also reviewed and provided feedback on all the deliverables. Notably there was a general consensus that the deliverables from the Biodiversity Specialist was inadequate.

Output 2 – No additional progress on this output since the last quarter. It was envisaged that the Biodiversity Specilaist would have started consultations or focus group discussions with key stakeholders subsequent to the requests for information towards the preparation of the Fifth National report, however this was not done. To date only six (6) of the thirty-five (35) receipient of the request letters have responded.

Output 3 – A major task under this output is to enhance and update the web content and technological capacity for the Jamaica CHM website that includes a link to the Fifth National Report, the national invasive alien species database and new links to biodiversity knowledge networks of relevance to Jamaica. In this regard significant progress has been made. On behalf of the CHM/IOJ, NEPA undertook the procurement/recruitment of an International Trainer/Co-Facilitator (via Direct Contracting) which was completed on May 22, 2015 and officially contracted on June 23, 2015. The NBSAP Project Management Unit facilitated and provided logistical support for the CHM/IOJ's National Invasive Species Data and Information Entry Workshop. The International Trainer/Workshop Co-Facilitator conducted training at the workshop which was held June 24-25, 2015. The IT hardware equipment and software procured for the CHM, has been received by the Agency and are being inventorized for submission to the CHM/IOJ.

Other activities/accomplishments by the project included:

During the period, one (1) PSC meeting was facilitated on June 10, 2015. Due to recurrent issues regarding the BS Consultancy, in particular low/late delivery and non-conformity to contract nor work plan; the Agency took a decision was taken to terminate the contract of the BS effective June 12, 2015. Based on recommendations, a TOR was prepared for the Joint Consultancy of Biodiversity/ Integration and Coordination Specialist and finalized in collaboration with the PSC. The procurement for this consultancy has commenced via the placement of an advertisement on the Government's Procurement Page on June 23, 2015 and NEPA's Website soliciting Request for Proposals from Environmental Firms in the next quarter (July 15, 2015).

Challenges encountered was primarily the low delivery rate and the subsequent termination of the BS Contract which has significantly impacted the overall delivery and by extension the rate of spend on the project.
