I. SUMMARY OF PROGRESS TOWARDS OUTPUTS (DESCRIBE PROJECT PROGRESS OUTPUT, CHALLENGES AND OTHER MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS DURING THE QUARTER)

The major achievement for the Project for the period are outlined below:

Output 1 – The multi-sectoral/stakeholder NBSAP TWG has now been established; fifteen (15) members have been confirmed, it is envisaged that at least 3 additional members will also be confirmed.

The Gender Responsive Stocktaking and the Gap Analysis and Lessons Learnt exercises have commenced by the Biodiversity Specialist and first drafts of the respective exercises has beed submitted. There has been no activities towards the setting of National biodiversity targets; the Biodiversity Specialist has plans to undertake this process in the next quarter. Additionally the Project Roadmap was completed by the Technical Project Manager; the International Advisor has subsequently reviewed and provided feedback on the document.

Output 2 – It was envisaged that the Biodiversity Specilaist would have started consultations or focus group discussions with key stakeholders subsequent to the requests for information towards the preparation of the Fifth National report, however this was not done. To date only six (6) of the thirty-five (35) receipient of the request letters have responded.

Output 3 – Activities towards the Strengthening of the CHM at IOJ were inter alia: Procurement for the Renewal of the Arc GIS Licence for the CHM was completed; Contribution towards the purchase of Satellite Imagery for Jamaica was also approved and payment made to the Land Information Council of Jamaica via the Ministry of Water Land Environment and Climate Change (MWLECC) on behalf of the IOJ. The services of the Project Assistant for the CHM was also completed, the candidate was selected on March 11, 2015 and contracted on March 26, 2015. Request for Proposal was done for the supply of IT hardware and Software for the CHM was also completed.

Other accomplishments by the project included:

- The contracting of the Biodiversity Specialist and the International Advisor on January 12, 2015 and February 1, 2015 respectively.
- The facilitation of two (2) PSC meetings (January 29th and March 25th).
- TPM participation in the Caribbean Sub-regional Capacity Building Workshop on Mainstreaming Biosafety into National Biodiversity Strategies and Action Plans and Resource Mobilization, St. Johns, Antigua March 9-13, 2015.

Challenges encountered was primarily the late submission of deliverables from the Biodiversity Specialist, which has impacted the delivery of the International Advisor, hence a negative impact on the overall delivery of the project.
