The Kenya Integrated Climate Risk Management Project (KICRMP) is designed to promote climate resilience in Kenya over the next three years (2013-2015). The project seeks to strengthen country's capacity to design and implement activities aimed at addressing the changing patterns of climate-related disasters and build national and sectoral capacity for climate analysis and application and help mitigate climate-induced risks and impacts on development processes and community livelihoods.

The key results expected from the KICRMP include among others: a national gender responsive DRR-CCA framework; climate risk profiles for three counties; CRM mainstreamed into national and sector specific development plans and community resilience to climate risks developed through community-based projects. The KICRMP will promote partnership and coordination at national and county level, and will be implemented directly by UNDP KCO, but in close collaboration with Government of Kenya and other institutions.
