Brief description

Based on an evaluation of the ombudsman institution conducted in mid-2008 UN Agencies resumed its cooperation with the Kyrgyz Ombudsman Institution and plan to implement a technical assistance programme. The programme will be implemented as a Joint UN programme by UNDP (Democratic Governance Programme), UNICEF, OHCHR, UNIFEM and UNHCR together with the Kyrgyz Ombudsman.

In line with the National Programme on Human Rights for the years 2002-2010 the Ombudsman Institution has been established in 2002. According to Art. 58 Para 20 of the Constitution 2007 the Ombudsman is elected by the Parliament. Art 81 gives him the "the control over the implementation of liberties and Human Rights". The Ombudsman is an independent institution under the parliament. Unfortunately during the following years the work of the ombudsman institution did not meet expectations and its practical impact on strengthening rule of law and protection of Human Rights between 2002 and 2008 is generally considered to be low.

The current state of the ombudsman institution indicates the need for a more comprehensive approach in order to make the Kyrgyz ombudsman institution an effective tool to protect and promote human rights. The past six month of cooperation between UN and the ombudsman institution have revealed the willingness and commitment of the senior management of the ombudsman institution for reform and to address existing problems.

The UN Technical Assistance Programme for the Kyrgyz Ombudsman Institution is developed on the phases basis. The first phase is to be implemented in 2009 and targeted to the improvement of the organizational structure and capacity building of the Ombudsman Institution. The second phase will be launched if the Phase 1 outputs are successfully achieved and Ombudsman Institution demonstrated strong commitment to the reform process.

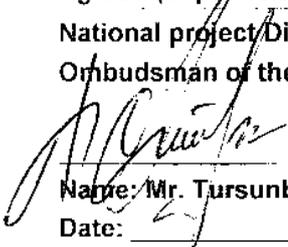
