
Brief Description						
<p>St Kitts and Nevis acceded to the Vienna Convention for the Protection of the Ozone Layer and the Montreal Protocol on Substances that Deplete the Ozone Layer, its London Amendment, Copenhagen Amendment and the Montreal and Beijing Amendments. St Kitts and Nevis is classified as an Article 5 country under the Protocol.</p> <p>St Kitts and Nevis completely phased out the consumption of Annex A, Group 1 Chlorofluorocarbons (CFCs) in 2006 and has commenced the process of phasing out consumption of Annex C, Group 1 Hydro-chlorofluorocarbons (HCFCs) through implementation of the HCFC phase-out management plan (HPMP).</p> <p>The HPMP will enable St Kitts and Nevis to meet all of the Montreal Protocol's HCFC control targets.
