What do we want to achieve:

Enhancing Women Participation in peace building and Post-conflict Planning project is a joint initiative of UNDP, UN Women and EU to ensure greater participation of women in peace building and post-conflict planning and supporting efforts to ensure the implementation of commitments on women, peace and security with a particular focus on ensuring greater participation and leadership of women in peace building and post-conflict recovery.

To advance towards this goal in Kosovo - UNDP component will provide with:

- Mapping of initiatives on Women Peace and Security in Kosovo from 1999- 2012;
- Dialogue with Women's, Youth and Men's group in 9 selected Municipalities of Kosovo;
- Publication of Public Pulse on Women, Peace and Security issues;

Results:

- Mapping of initiatives on Women, Peace and Security in Kosovo collected in one database and analysis provided for use by UN, EU and participating NGOs and other stakeholders;
- Dialogues with Men's, Women's and youth groups in 9 targeted municipalities completed with resulting recommendations for gender mainstreaming and security screening for documents related to municipal planning
- Production of Report on Women, Peace and Security issues in Kosovo and analysis of the drivers of and obstacles to change (including political and economic constraints).
