II. Purpose

1. Main Objectives of the Project: *(as per the approved UNDP Country Programme Document and Country Programme Action Plan and/or Project Document)*

Project Development Objective

The project will strengthen the technical and institutional capacity to assist the Lao People's Democratic Republic in mainstreaming climate change concerns into sectoral and national development priorities, including the Seventh (7th) National Socio-Economic Development Plan.

Project Immediate Objective

The project will enable the Lao People's Democratic Republic to prepare and submit its second national communication to the UNFCCC and meet its Convention obligations

III. PROJECT PERFORMANCE AND RESULTS

1. Contribution to the strategic goals *[To be completed in cooperation with UNDP Programme Analyst]*

Intended Outcome

The overall project output is the Second National Communication Report that is prepared and approved by the Government for submission to the UNFCCC. **Details of the current outputs are as the followings;**

1. National Circumstances Chapter (Output I)
2. National Greenhouse gas inventory (Output II)
3. Programme containing measures to facilitate adequate adaptation to climate change is (Output III)
4. Other information considered relevant to achievement of the objective of the convention (Output V)
5. Effective management (Output VIII)
6. Address climate change challenges (Output IX)

Progress towards achieving outcome *[A brief analysis of the status of the situation and any observed change, any project contribution.]*

Outcome 1: National Circumstances Chapter :

There is a strong engagement and leadership from the technical working groups in this output (National Circumstances). The draft version of the chapter has been completed in Lao language and has been circulated for comments. Following the submission of the draft report by the local consultant, a meeting was held at the project office with UNDP's Program Analyst to discuss the draft. It was agreed that there was a need to use updated data as the baseline used by the consultants for this was derived from the First National Communications on Climate Change which was completed in October, 2000, the consultant has been instructed to coordinate and consult more with the technical working groups to acquire updated data while keeping an eye on good practices of IPCC guidelines. The technical working groups have access to more recent

data base. Consultation workshops are planned for the first quarter of 2010 in order to finalize the chapter by integrating the comments received from different stakeholders.

Outcome 2: National Greenhouse Gas Inventory :

The project organized a three day training workshop which was conducted by an international consultant to nineteen members of the technical working groups, climate change office and project staff and also local consultants. The workshop aimed at familiarizing the participants with the tools for conducting greenhouse inventories and IPCC guidelines. Based on the training, the project has initiated data collection and compilation. The project has received a draft report of the GHG and is being circulated for comments. This inventory is being conducted with support from the technical working groups.

Outcome 3: Programme containing measures to facilitate adequate adaptation to climate change :

The project also organized a three day workshop, back to back, to the GHG training conducted by an international consultant. Similar to the GHG inventory workshop, the technical working group, climate change office and project staff members were trained on vulnerability and adaptation assessment. The project has recruited a consultant to conduct this study and the consultant has submitted a draft version of the report in Lao language. Efforts are currently under way to translate the report into English. The report has also been circulated for comments. A workshop is planned in the first quarter to discuss the draft and also feels that there is a need for more training particularly in modeling techniques.

Outcome 4: Programs containing measures to mitigate climate change:

The project organized training for two CCO staff on mitigate climate change in Malaysia.

Outcome 5: Other information considered relevant to achievement of the objective of the convention :

The project was actively involved in generating awareness on climate change and its impact on the environment to different strata of the society. In this endeavor, the project supported fourteen schools comprising tentatively a thousand students for a campaign for 'green' schools. Similarly, the project also supported the Division of Promotion, under the Department of Environment, who in collaboration with the Ministry of Information also conducted climate change awareness programs through photo and painting completion, concerts including banners which were posted in strategic locations. The project also supported the activities of the government's program on World Environment Day. These activities were widely covered both in the print and the electronic media. This output contributed in generating awareness on climate change to the people at large.

Outcome 8: Effective management:

The management of the project has been improving, the project staff members and government staff have been practicing new tool for management such as Result Based Management and Project Financial Management. The project staff are receiving regular training from United Nations Development Program and the Department of International Cooperation to strengthen their management ability. The project is gradually contributing in enhancing the management capacity of the Climate Change Office, Department of Environment.

Outcome 9: Address climate change challenge: There has been a very strong political engagement and government leadership in addressing this output. The project organized two training/consultation programs, in collaboration with SNV and SDC, for the Lao Delegation in preparation for UNFCCC COP 15. These programs were aimed at familiarizing the Lao delegation on COP processes and strengthening the negotiation skills of the Lao delegation. The training programs were attended by high ranking officials of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Water Resources and Environment Administration (WREA), Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry including other relevant line agencies. The second training program was chaired and attended by HE Mme Khempeng Pholsena, Minister to the Prime Minister's Office and head of WREA who was also the deputy team leader of the Lao COP 15 delegation. The project also provided logistical and partial financial support to the Lao Delegation to attend COP 15. Furthermore, the project facilitated bilateral and multi lateral high level meetings, with different organizations, in Copenhagen for the Lao delegation where possibilities for new joint programs on climate change were discussed and there was overwhelming support for Laos and positive outcomes are expected.

The project was actively involved in generating awareness on climate change and its impact on the environment to different strata of the society. In this endeavor, the project supported fourteen schools comprising tentatively a thousand students for 'green' schools. Similarly, the project also supported the Division of Promotion, under the Department of Environment, who in collaboration with the Ministry of Information and Culture also conducted climate change awareness programs through photo and painting completion, concerts including banners which were posted in strategic locations. The project also supported the activities of the government's program on World Environment Day. These activities were widely covered both in the print and the electronic media. This output contributed in generating awareness on climate change to the people at large.

2. Update on implementation of the Vientiane Declaration and its Action Plan [Brief update on any achievement and/or problem related to the implementation of the Vientiane Declaration. It should also include issues related to the introduction of HACT and actions planned for the following period.]

The financial management, procurement procedures and recruitment process of the project has been based on the Vientiane Declaration. The government is trying its best to ensure that the planned activities and reporting are in line with the work plan.

The principle of the Harmonized Approach to Cash Transfer (HACT) has been regarded as important agenda for the implementation of the project activities. The current financial form provided under this principle has provided the management team simpler ways on how to link financial figures to the management of project activities. However, there is still a need to come up with a practical way in performing a financial analysis corresponding to the progresses of the project activities. There were difficulties in the beginning while introducing this system and the understanding is also limited to some extent.

The project in collaboration with the World Bank also organized a donor co-ordination meeting on June 30, 2009 with the aim of coordinating and mobilizing support for climate change activities

and avoiding duplication on efforts and waste of resources. The meeting was attended by ten donor agencies. The detailed list is annexed.

3. Update on partnerships *[Brief update on any achievement and/or problem in developing partnerships and inter-agency collaboration. It should also include strategies for south-south cooperation]*

Collaborative efforts are under way in strengthening and building synergy among different national, regional and international institutions and agencies. There is existing partnership between, SNV, ADB, WB, IGES and UNDP within the climate change office. With the arrival of the International Advisor, efforts are currently underway in developing a south-south partnership in program development and resource mobilization coupled with sharing lessons learned.

All the above mentioned partners including SDC supported the training and consultation workshop for the Lao PDR delegation to COP 15 which was organized with the aim of strengthening the capacity coupled with briefing the delegation on negotiation techniques.

6. Complication and time consuming to get formal approval for project activities
7. Project staff members are new to NIM policy and need time to familiarize themselves with the procedures. More relevant project staff members need to attend relevant trainings.
8. Need for training in English language to both the TWG and staff as materials and resources are in English and staff lack the proficiency.
9. Need for more working space as the project has grown and the space limited, it is reflecting on the efficiency and productivity of the team.
