II. Purpose

1. Main Objectives of the Project: *(as per the approved UNDP Country Programme Document and Country Programme Action Plan and/or Project Document)*

The overall objective of the project is to support with the government development goal in lifting the country from the ranks of LDCs by 2020 through the implementation of the Sixth-Five year plan (2006-2010), including the constituent poverty reduction strategy and the MDGs; and in monitoring and evaluating the results. New to the project in 2009 is the support to the Government of Lao in the formulation process of the 7th NSEDP. To address this, an additional outcome has been added to the project. Specifically, the project will help the Government of Lao PDR in achieving four outcomes.

- I. Incorporation of the poverty reduction and MDG priorities and programmes of the Sixth Plan (2006-2016) in the annual plan and budgets of selected Ministries and three pilot provinces and implementing them;
- II. NSEDP VII is formulated in participatory manner, is results-oriented enabling effective monitoring and integrates MDG and other national priorities (new addition – last year).
- III. Enhanced capacities of Ministry of Planning and Investment (MPI), selected Ministries and three pilot provinces for improved implementation monitoring, evaluation and reporting for NSEDP VI and NSEDP VII;
- IV. Establishment of a research network comprising the National Economic Research Institute (NERI) and selected Ministries and Agencies to undertake policy research to support planning, monitoring and evaluation.
- V. Initiate work on Poverty-Environment linkages with a view to recognise the importance this topic and incorporate it into the planning framework (new addition – last year)

III. PROJECT PERFORMANCE AND RESULTS

Progress towards achieving outcome [A brief analysis of the status of the situation and any observed change, any project contribution.]

Outcome1: Incorporation of the poverty reduction and MDG priorities and programmes of the Sixth Plan (2006-2016) in the annual plan and budgets of selected Ministries and three pilots.

- During the past few years, the activities in the area of MDGs have been achieved to a significant extent. The result and outstanding achievement was the MDG Costing Report was launched at the national level. The report is not only a statistical calculation of numbers, but it also provides an analytical framework for achieving the goals. The President of Lao PDR represented the country at the Global Summit in New York on MDGs – shows the importance of MDGs in the government. Moreover, it has shown that, even though Lao PDR is a small LDC, it is making efforts and is committed to achieving MDGs.
- 3,000 copies of the annual 2009-2010 NSEDP (English version) were published.
- Summary achievements on Annual NSEDP implementation during 2009-10 completed.
- Draft Annual NSEDP 2010-2011 (Lao version) improved and English translation completed.
- The Participatory Planning Manual for KUMBAN Development revised and finalised
- Conducted Participatory Planning exercise for 28 Kumbans of 14 Districts in 11 Provinces during the year.

Outcome2: NSEDP VII is formulated in a participatory manner and is results-oriented, enabling effective monitoring and integrating MDG and other national priorities.

- Draft of VII NSEDP (2011-2015) improved, by sharing at the national level and development partners.
- NSEDP VII English version translation completed (draft).

Outcome 5: Initiate work on Poverty-Environment linkages

2. Update on implementation of the Vientiane Declaration and its Action Plan [*Brief update on any achievement and/or problem related to the implementation of the Vientiane Declaration. It should also include issues related to the introduction of HACT and actions planned for the following period.*]

1. The project has followed the Vientiane Declaration on Aid Effectiveness quite successfully. However, the project over the 4-5 years has been fully integrated with the Ministry of Planning and Investment; therefore, it is not always easy to identify which activity is of (or supported by) the project and which by the ministry. Hence, to a rank outsider there might be some outlying cases, which might appear not to follow the Vientiane Declaration to the letter and spirit. This however would be an incorrect reading of the situation for the reason mentioned above. On the other hand, since the MPI (and the project) have worked in close partnership with different line ministries, provincial and district authorities and also other donors in an integrated fashion, it is evident that the spirit of partnership in the Vientiane Declaration has been fully upheld.
2. In terms of substantial work, there has been tangible progress. The different objectives have been fulfilled, and the broadest indicator of this has been the success of the 6th Plan – in some areas, it has more than achieved the set targets, like the economic growth rates, industrial production, and human development and selects MDG goals. The contribution of the project in terms it's laid down objectives has been successful, though there has been some shift in priorities, for example, in the case of M&E (a point made earlier). However, in the spirit of Vientiane Declaration this was made clear to the donors and other stakeholders well in advance along with the reasons thereof (and hence maintained transparency).
3. In terms of administration and finance, there has been no problem per se. The staff members are dedicated, and so are the commitments from the ministry counterparts. On the downside, however, there has been a relatively large turnover of project personnel. Reasons: Temporary jobs, perhaps salary structures (not comparable with the private sector in short term jobs), a perceived distance between the project staff and the government regular staff, and sometimes personal issues like going for further studies or maternity leaves. High attrition rate has also meant, new staff has to learn the job each time, and this has affected the productivity.

3. Update on partnerships [*Brief update on any achievement and/or problem in developing partnerships and inter-agency collaboration. It should also include strategies for south-south cooperation*]

This project has facilitated a great number of partnerships to emerge and flourish.

1. In the Kumban planning, there has been a great deal of joint work with partners in the government at provincial, district and villages, civil society and people at large. Inter-donor agency cooperation was achieved since SNV Netherlands was also a partner.
2. In the MDG Costing exercise, almost all the UN and Brettonwood Institutions (WB, ADB) were closely consulted with, in addition to different ministries and provincial agencies
3. A similar exercise was repeated while preparing the 7th NSEDP Document.
4. The Kumban Planning Manual was prepared in a highly participative manner with partners from different ministries and ministry-equivalents in addition to international partners.

5. While not much tangible progress has been made in M&E for reason explained earlier, whatever little has been done, has been done in close collaboration with concerned departments and ministries, especially DOS and NERI.

However, during the year there has been turnover of project personnel, which has created difficulties and some struggles of the project work in terms of Financial, programme and administrative matters. Thus, it would in some circumstance affected to the Audit preparation.

6. List main challenges and issues (if any) faced during reporting period [as well as response strategies adopted]

Time management, scheduling and follow up are major challenges that the government has to address. Meetings are organised with some difficulty, since most senior government officials are very busy. Next, the procedures are at times arduous and time consuming.

Reading per se is scant in the culture and needs inculcation. In this regard, linguistic skills (esp. in English) are a prerequisite for all in the government. The government must take this up on priority.

Inter-department/ministry collaboration, though achieved to an extent in this project, still stays a challenge.
