II. PURPOSE

Since joining the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) in July 1997, the Lao PDR has emphasized the importance of full integration into ASEAN through active participation in economic, political, security and socio-cultural affairs. Economic cooperation, in particular, and the inclusion in the ASEAN Free Trade Area (AFTA) is seen as being crucial for the development of the country.

However, full integration poses various challenges for Laos in which, among the most significant ones include: increasing the capacity of the GoL to manage the process of integration; analyzing the impacts of AFTA and other Free Trade Agreements have been concluded and under negotiations and finding ways to achieve maximum benefits from ASEAN economic integration and other aspects of ASEAN integration; increasing understanding among local officials, business leaders and the general public in order to get benefit from AFTA and other aspects of ASEAN integration.

During 2004 and 2005, Laos held the Chair of the ASEAN Standing Committee, which thrust Laos into the centre stage of ASEAN affairs, brought positive international exposure to Laos and provided the opportunity for Laos to focus on regional integration. During this period, UNDP provided support to the GoL through a 12-month Preparatory Assistance (PA) Project that delivered capacity building and technical assistance to meet the short-term needs of the GoL.

A further three-year cooperation project has been planned, which will build on Laos' successful chairmanship of the ASEAN Standing Committee and the positive achievements of the UNDP PA Project. The new project, implemented by the ASEAN Department of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, for the 2007-2010 period achieved the following key outcomes:

- Increased national commitment to the process of ASEAN integration.
- Improved capacity to coordinate ASEAN affairs within the Government of Lao PDR.
- Enhanced national capacity to assess policy implications of regional integration.

- 1. Ownership: ASEAN Department of MoFA, the Lao ASEAN National Secretariat and the focal point of Lao Government for ASEAN integration, has taking the full ownership and leadership in this project by spearheading all the project activities. The ASEAN Department and the project team have actively updated the public and private sector on ASEAN related issues from different kind of means, for instance, workshops and printing materials. In addition, the project has provided capacity strengthening to line ministries at the central and provincial level through different kind of training for instance English training in Saravan province and project management training in Vientiane.
- **2. Alignment:** The project activities are aligned with the government priorities in the area of ASEAN integration.
- **3.** Harmonizing and Simplification: as a NIM project, the project has followed all the UNDP NIM guideline during its operation.
- **4. Managing for results:** The project applied Result Based Management in implementing this project and has tries to make use all the project resource efficiently. To ensure the project results delivered as planned monthly meeting, project board meeting and annual review meeting etc have been organized properly.
- **5. Mutual Accountability:** The project and UNDP have dovetailed in implementing and delivering the project results through out the project lifetime.

3. Update on partnerships

The ASEAN Department, Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MoFA) is the central focal point and coordinating agency for Laos-ASEAN cooperation and is therefore well placed to be the main implementing agency and facilitated the participation of other GoL Line Ministries, including the Ministry of Industry and Commerce, Ministry of Finance, Ministry of Planning and Investment, Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry, Ministry of Information and Culture, and the Institute of Foreign Affairs. The project has also involved active participation of provincial government officials, private sectors and the general public. Apart from this, as central focal point, ASEAN Department has also facilitated coordination among line ministries and relevant agencies for ASEAN matters.

4. Update on gender mainstreaming

The Project attached great importance to gender mainstreaming in project activities. The project also values gender equal opportunity in the work place. The project has tried to deliver the support of the project to men and women equally, for example the project has always done its best in balancing the number of men and women in all its training and workshops. Beside this, the ASEAN department has actively disseminates Declaration on the Elimination of Violence Against Women in the ASEAN Region in various workshops.

- Government officials at provincial and central level are better informed on the ASEAN related issues.

Future Plan

- Given the positive results of this project and number of challenges in the coming years, the ASEAN Department would like to request for the UNDP support the new phase of this project. The new project may focus on strengthening the capacity of government officials and private sector on :
- Negotiation skills, including in the areas of trade in goods, trade in services and investment;
- Organising more workshops and seminars on the issues related to ASEAN human rights, in particular, the promotion of human rights in the region.
- Monitoring and evaluation system to track the progress and assess the impacts of ASEAN integration on Laos.
- Business management, including market information, access to financial resources and technical know-how so as to increase their competitiveness.
