II. PURPOSE

The United Nations Environment Program (UNEP) and the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) Poverty Environment Initiative (PEI) in Lao PDR aims to contribute to poverty reduction and improved well-being of poor and vulnerable groups through mainstreaming the environment into national development and investment processes. PEI in Lao PDR aims to strengthen capacity of targeted central and provincial authorities to integrate poverty-environment concerns and opportunities in key development planning processes. The Initiative is not one stand-alone project but has been designed primarily to provide targeted support to ongoing programmes.

The specific objective of PEI Output 5 is to enhance capacities of national and provincial authorities to plan and manage investments for poverty reduction and sound environmental managements.

UNDAF Outcomes/Indicators: UNDAF Outcome 1: By 2011, the livelihoods of poor, vulnerable and food insecure populations are enhanced through sustainable development (within DMG framework)

Expected Outcomes/Indicators: Outcome 1.1: Improved and equitable access to land, markets and social and economic services, environmentally utilization of natural resources, with balance population growth.

Expected Outputs/Indicators: Output 1.2: The role of biodiversity, agro-biodiversity, land management and environment and environment in general in livelihood improvements and poverty reduction strengthened through enhanced knowledge management and management capacity. Outcome 1.3: Enhanced management capacity of the Government in meeting its international environmental obligations through strengthened implementation of multilateral environmental agreements and related national policies and legislation.

III. PROJECT PERFORMANCE AND RESULTS

1. Contribution to the strategic goals

Progress towards achieving outcome

The project got off to a slower start than expected with the PEI Senior Technical Advisor only getting on board in February 1 and the new National Consultant on March 22. The late start with having a full permanent team on board has led to some inevitable delays with implementation of planned activities.

While not part of the official PEI workplan, a communications strategy has been developed with the objectives to generate awareness of PEI and create knowledge products that can inform decision-making towards sustainable investment management. This work is motivated by the direction/discussions during the PEI Regional Lessons Learning workshop held in Vientiane, June 2010. To date, PEI factsheets have been developed in Lao and English, and seven policy briefs have been completed to highlight various investment issues in specific sectors, and on poverty-environment issues in the pursuit of economic growth.

Output 1: Improved capacities at the national level in mainstreaming environmental obligations and Multilateral Environmental Agreements (MEAs) within national sustainable development plans and poverty reduction strategies.

Project has formed the expert working group and has been fully engaged in the research project, both in terms of participation in the discussion of environmental economic concepts and in the selection of research sites. Moreover, Project also has training workshop on evaluation of ecological values of land use change (with emphasis on forest and agriculture) was held at Bankern, 25-29 October, 2010. The training was led by the international consultant with technical support from the PEI STA. The objectives were to provide technical guidance to the national expert group in setting up a methodological framework for assessing the environmental costs and benefits of different land use scenarios. The workshop is also to enhance integration between the different technical disciplines. There were about 20 participants at the workshop, including national expert group members, student researchers, NERI's junior officers, UNDP environment unit staff and representatives from concerned line ministries. Following the training workshop, the international consultant worked closely with the national experts group to identify the suite of ecosystem services that will be measured and valued in the case studies, and on the specific land use change scenarios. In choosing these ecosystem services, particular emphasis was given to data availability, possible use of local proxies and ease of analysis.

The environmental valuation analysis will be a steep learning curve for many of the national experts as this is a very new field in the country. However, the members have demonstrated very heartening motivation and enthusiasm. The project will need to generate appropriate incentives to maintain this level of interest as we move into the more demanding analytical process

Output 2: Improved understanding of policy makers who are involved in the implementation of MEA and/or environmental objectives and poverty reduction strategies on the links among ecosystem services, natural capital, economic development and human development, and their importance for achieving the MEA and/or environmental obligations.

The first field study visit was conducted in Oudomxay province from 10-18 July, 2010 in order to select sites for the study on Evaluation of Ecological Values of Land Use Change. Consequently, Houn, Beng and Namor districts of Oudomxay province were chosen as the possible sites for the study. A field visit to Oudomxay was conducted to confirm selection of

research sites for the study. During this trip, the team held meetings at the district and provincial levels and visited select villages to collect the primary data in Houn, Beng and Namor district. The field visit was from 30 October to 5 November 2010 and included members of the National Expert group, the International consultant and assigned provincial and district officers. Several workshops to design and finalize the research questionnaire for field data collection were organized on the 1st and 29th December, 2010 with participation by expert group members, and the university research students and junior NERI' officers who will be carrying out the research. The objective was to discuss, refine and finalize the draft questionnaire for financial and socio-economic data collection of the maize, upland rice and rubber plantation and NTFPs land use options. The group has made excellent progress in the development of the questionnaire leveraging on their expertise in the agriculture, forestry and economic skills. The international consultant and PEI STA is working closely with the team to ensure that there is consistency in data collection across all the land use options and that proper environmental data is incorporated into the survey. A final set of survey questionnaires and a draft template for data input in Excel has now been developed.

Output 3: Improved awareness of policy makers on the MA and its recommendations for effective environmental and development policy making, and their capacities to integrate them into actual policy making processes

There were no activities under Output 3 this year, the activities in this output will be done in 2011 as the National Communication Outreach will be hired. Mostly, this output is for project management and Financial training in the year 2010.


The Expected Accomplishments


