### Brief Description

This project is designed to build a solid foundation on which Liberia's extractive sectors can be efficiently and transparently managed for the shared benefit of its citizens. The project will therefore enhance knowledge and skills of policy makers and technicians as well, in the application of administrative and regulatory mechanisms of the extractive sectors in general but with specific focus on the oil and gas sectors. Adopting a systemic approach, the project seeks deeper participation of civil society encompassing women's and youth's participation in advocating transparency, accountability and as well as managing conflict for peace, stability and development.


The project envisions six outputs:

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6. The impact of Liberia's extractive industry on human development is documented, lessons drawn and disseminated to the wider public




