With reference to your letter dated 20 February 2015, I am pleased to inform you that the Government of Japan has approved the project documents for the projects listed under "Assistance to Africa", and that on 18 March 2015, the Government of Japan will deposit the sum of thirty-five million seven hundred sixty-six thousand United States Dollars (USD 35,766,000) in the form of a grant to the Japan/UNDP Partnership Fund to the designated bank account for these projects.

In accordance with the approval of these projects and the disbursement of this grant, the Government of Japan requests UNDP to undertake the following:

- The projects should be implemented in accordance with the 'Policies and Procedures' of the Japan-UNDP Partnership Fund.
- 2) Every effort should be made to publicize that the projects are funded by Japan in partnership with UNDP in accordance with the 'Policies and Procedures' 4. It would be preferable to clearly refer to the fact that the projects are funded by Japan in publications and articles regarding the projects. Furthermore, UNDP is requested to submit materials, including press releases, promotional materials featuring Japan's ODA logo that were actually used, and pictures of the projects' implementation, accordingly.
- 3) The respective UNDP Country Office in each project country should periodically submit progress reports, including financial disbursement records, for each project to the respective Embassy of Japan in the project country.

4) A final report including accounting statements should be submitted to the Government of Japan upon completion of each project. The statements should be based on actual expenditures.

To confirm acceptance of this contribution, the Government of Japan requests UNDP to promptly forward a receipt upon completion of the aforementioned deposit.
