But Dr. Anthony said the VAT legislation already contained a provision for charitable organizations to apply for exemptions. He said the authorities and the Archbishop of Castries, His Grace Robert Rivas, had been in dialogue on the process to be applied under the VAT for imports of food and other supplies.

The barrel concessions, according to the resolution, would apply on "unsolicited personal items including food, clothing, toys and other household consumables" but not on electronic items and items for commercial use. The exemption is limited to "a maximum of two barrels for each household."

Another resolution amended Schedule 2 of the VAT Act to grant further exemptions to building materials such as paints and varnishes; plumbing fittings; plastic water tanks; building blocks and bricks; safety glass (toughened or laminated glass); laminated and corrugated galvanize; various wire meshing; and masonry and roofing nails. Dr. Anthony said this resolution was part of the effort to "remedy the cracks" in the process of the implementation of VAT. "It is going to be a long journey...members should be patient," he said.

According to a Caribbean 360 News report, disgruntled officials of the Trade Union Federation (TUF) stormed out of wage talks with Government Wednesday claiming they felt insulted at the administration's zero response to their wage proposal for public sector workers for the 2010-2013 triennium. The report says that TUF officials

The report says that TUF officials who placed a request for a 16 per cent increase spread over three years were stunned by the government's proposed wage freeze over the three year period and immediate payment of EC\$1000 Christmes heave Christmas bonus.
"At the meeting with the

At the meeting with the Government negotiating team we were offered a wage freeze. We were told to take zero for the first year, zero for the second year and zero for the third year and in lieu of that to accept a one-time payment of one thousand dollars.

We indicated to the government egotiation team that we consider the

negotiation team that we consider the offer an insult, and therefore we were unable to continue any discussions with them," Monrose said.

The TUF official said their request for a 16 percent increase would involve an increase of five per cent in the first year, five per cent in the second and six

per cent in the third.

But he said based on the response of the Government's negotiation team the unions will now be meeting separately with their members, cautioning that the government team should allow good sense to prevail at the soonest. the soonest.

"The survival of this country is important to all of us, we all live here so important to all of us, we all live here so we take everything into consideration. We feel just as responsible as anyone else to save this country when it needs saving, so we are not in a position to contemplate any form of industrial action at this time. The only immediate action we will embark on is to continue to consult our members and continue to consult our members and continue

to consult our memorers and continue to talk to the government negotiating team in the hope that good sense will prevail," he added.

The wage talks between the Trade Union Federation and the government negotiators are several months overdue.

negotiators are several months overdue and were only able to get underway this week following the intervention of Prime Minister Kenny Anthony. The Federation, which appeared to have been gearing up for some form of protest action over the delay, had issued an ultimatum to government requesting the commencement of requesting the commencement of negotiations by Thursday last week. Monrose says he hopes to wrap up discussions on wages by December 12.

### **Grenada Welcomes Removal** Of Schengen Visas

PRIME Minister and Minister for Foreign Affairs of Grenada, Hon. Tillman Thomas has welcomed a polley decision by the European Commission to allow Grenadians to travel to the Schengen area without needing a visa, as constructive.

The Prime Minister said on Friday that the decision provides

said on Friday that the decision provides Grenadians with the chance to take advantage of opportunities that may arise from business exchanges and people to people contact.

He welcomed the announcement from Cecilia Malmström, EU

Commissioner for Home Affairs, that the change is more than "just a symbolic gesture" and is intended to have a direct impact between the European Commission and Grenada.

"This is a very positive step for Grenada and the four other Caribbean countries that will benefit from the change. It will increase opportunities for our people travelling to Europe and it will make it easier for the development of easier for development partnerships. welcome this development because it will also impact our tourism industry," the

Prime Minister said.

The objective is to simplify travel to the simplify travel to the Schengen area, as well as to Cyprus, Bulgaria and Romania. Nationals from one of these countries would no longer require a visa for short stays (up to 90 days) if he/she is in possession of a passport, be it for business, touristic of family visit purposes.

This will make travel lanning easier and

This will make tavel planning easier and reduce the travelling costs. Member States limited consular presence in many of these countries has resulted in visa applicants often having to travel abroad to apply for a Schengen visa.
