No Rest For Cops

The Royal Saint Lucia Police Force has undoubtedly had a very busy year fighting crime. And the past weekend was not unlike the usual trend that police have been accustomed to of late.
Over the weekend, law enforcement had to contend with four major events that seemed to cut into observances held for this year's Police Week which ended last Sunday.
According to police, the first incident occurred last Saturday evening when Criminal Investigations Department officers responded to a slashing on the walkover bridge near Choc Gap.
Police say a nineteen-year-old male attacked and slashed the throat of eight-year-old Elodie Francis of Agard, Morne Dudon. After slashing the young woman's throat from ear to ear, cops say the male assailant, who attends the same learning institution as the victim, slashed his own throat.
Following the incident, both Francis and her assailant were taken to Victoria Hospital, treated and discharged. Francis's attacker was subsequently arrested by police for attempted murder and charges are expected to be brought against him shortly.
Within hours, around 5:45 am on Sunday, another altercation resulted in the death of one man with another being seriously injured.
According to a press release from the Police Public Relations Office, two men were attacked by an individual known to them wielding a metal object. The incident occurred at the Vieux Fort Fisheries Complex.
Reports are that fifty-four-year-old George Alfred of Hospital Road, Vieux Fort and thirty-six-year-old Shervon George of Pierrot, Vieux Fort sustained injuries during that early morning attack. They were subsequently taken to St. Jude Hospital where Alfred was pronounced dead on arrival while George was treated and admitted and said to be in stable condition.
Police say a post mortem on Alfred's body is scheduled for today and one man is currently in police custody assisting them with their investigations.
Meanwhile, the Special Police Constable accused of assaulting a Castries man late last month has been charged with grievous harm.
SPC 221 Nestor Flemius, a member of the Special Services Unit (SSU) was slapped with the charge last Sunday following an incident that occurred on Friday, November 23. During that incident that occurred around 3:00 am at City Gate, Castries, Flemius is said to have been involved in an altercation with thirty-five-year-old Amrand James of City Gate, Castries.
As a result of receiving a blow to the left ear with a firearm by the officer, James now suffers from facial paralysis.
The SSU officer appeared in a Gros Islet court yesterday where he was bailed the sum of ECS\$8000 as suitable surety. The case was adjourned to January 17, 2013.
On Sunday, too, police made a sizeable marijuana bust in the south of the island. That bust occurred around 11:20 pm when the Marine and Drug Units pursued and intercepted just off Moule-a-Chique, Vieux Fort.
Police say that after they boarded and searched the vessel and its occupants, two hundred and fifty-two pounds of compressed dry green marijuana was discovered. The four occupants of the vessel named "Jah Guide" included a Vincentian national.
Cops say during that seizure, one of the occupants sustained a gunshot wound to his upper right thigh and was subsequently taken to St. Jude Hospital and treated.
Police have since taken the four men into custody and charges are expected to be made against them shortly.
Just last week, Police Commissioner of Police Vernon Francois told The VOICE that despite the many challenges being faced by the Force, cops are assiduously working towards clamping down on criminality.
Adequate resources, Francois said, were just one of the factors that are forcing the police's already thin resources to counter the sharp spate of crime that is now stretching the Force's resources thin.

Government Reports On First Month Of VAT

Over the past few days, there has been considerable speculation about the amount of money collected by the Government from VAT. Already, it has been claimed that the Government has collected more than enough to pay public officers.

Consistent with the undertaking given by the Prime Minister and Minister for Finance and Economic Affairs, the Government is pleased to indicate the amount collected from VAT for the first month of operation. The Inland Revenue Department collected a total of BCS10.06 million. In turn, the Customs Department collected BCS15.08 million. The total amount collected is, therefore, \$25.14 million.

It should be noted that the amount collected in VAT by the Customs and Excise Department is gross, meaning that a significant amount has to be refunded based on the refund mechanism of the VAT system. The amount to be refunded is being calculated and has not yet been determined at this time.

If the performance is evaluated on the basis of an eight month period that is to say from April to November, then the overall performance at the end of November 2012 would be slightly lower than the comparative period for 2011. In 2010 the total amount collected in the taxes that replaced VAT that is consumption tax, hotel accommodation tax, environmental protection levy, cellular tax and motor vehicle rental fee

was \$125.41 million while in 2011 the total amount collected was \$126.26 million. However, the cumulative amount collected in these taxes including VAT for the April to November 2012 period was only \$125.81 million. In effect, there has been no windfall in collections in VAT for the first month of its existence, as claimed by some.

According to Prime Minister Dr. Kenny D. Anthony, "It is really in the next few months that we will get a better sense of how well the tax is performing. Understandably, there were anomalies in the first month of operation both from importers and consumers. As the tax settles, I would expect some improvement in collections in the months ahead."
