Development and application of the innovative (re)integration model aimed at mitigation of consequences of homelessness throughout increasing their employability and integration into labour market. The project will be implemented in Vilnius, the metropolitan that becomes an attraction center for intensified homeless migration. The project is aimed at development of an individualized assistance model for homeless in Lithuania (based on evaluation of current work practices, human as well as organizational capacities and successful international practices of FEANSA organization), training of social workers on how to practically implement the measures described in the reintegration model in their daily work practices and practical implementation of the model in 2 shelter homes in Vilnius City.

I. SITUATION ANALYSIS

The survey carried in 2003 indicated 2500 Lithuanian inhabitants as being homeless however there is a common thinking that this number was underestimated. There is no precise estimation of the number of street homeless in Lithuania in 2008. As regular practise, the statistics on street homelessness is based on the number or persons who applied for social assistance services in municipalities' social services centres. According to the official data of the Statistics Lithuania under the Government of the Republic of Lithuania, there we 1800 persons who temporarily lived in shelter homes country wide, plus for about 100 persons were provided temporary shelter services for one night.

According to the data provided by Vilnius City Municipality Social Assistance Division in 2006, there were for about 500 homeless in Vilnius city. However there is no statistical data on the number of persons living in slums, cellars, waste sites and other places.

There are 23 shelter homes for homeless established and operating in Lithuania however they accept only persons having their personal identification documents (IDs), so called *privileged street homeless*. Specialists working with homeless note an increased internal migration of homeless to biggest cities of Lithuania, especially Vilnius, which is going to intensify due to closure/modernisation according to European Union (EU) requirements of waste sites in 2009. Thus, the project will be implemented in two largest institutions working with homeless in Vilnius City municipality. Practitioners working with homeless depict a typical picture of a homeless in Lithuania composed of such characteristics as: mostly men suffering from dependency from psychotropic substances, most of them exprisoners and/or people aged 50 and+ (data derived from interviews with Lithuanian practitioners working with homeless, 2008). The group of persons having above mentioned characteristics will form a target beneficiaries' group of this Project.

The problem faced is the absence of statistical data on street homelessness at country level as well as in Vilnius municipality and inadequate knowledge and capacities of two biggest organisations working with homeless in Vilnius City municipality to prevent increasing homelessness and to ensure effective harm reduction of homelessness through their (re)integration into society and eventually into labour market. Efforts taken to effectively address this problem contribute to: 1) Outcome_10 that is set and reported against by the UNDP Lithuania, and eventually to 2) MDG1 at country level.

II. STRATEGY

The outputs of the Project will directly contribute to the implementation at country level of practical recommendations of the European Parliament's non-legislative resolution on ending street homelessness. The document contains the EU-wide commitment to end street homelessness by 2015 and the development of integrated policies by Member States to ensure access to affordable quality housing for all.

Development of innovative and tailored model based on the best EU countries practises and institutional capacities evaluation carried in two project partners organisations working with homeless, training of social workers in partner organisations to effectively employ the methods recommended in model's description in their daily work practises and practical testing of the model's principles in two shelters in Vilnius will create the pre-conditions for:

- 1) Preparation of the practical guide steaming out of the lessons learnt of practically implemented in Vilnius city municipality innovative and tailored model of homelessness prevention and mitigation of fenomena's consequences through their integration into society and labour market.
- 2) Increase employability and employment rates (including the period staying in the same job for up to 6 months and longer) of targeted beneficiaries by at least 40 percent.

UNDP Lithuania will play a catalytic role in bringing into a partnership two biggest organisations working with homeless in Vilnius City municipality aiming firstly to examine their capacity development needs in regard to ensuring more effective homelessness prevention and their integration into society and labour market, and secondly, using an international expertise will facilitate working out a tailored model for addressing homelessness to be applied in these two organisations, and thirdly, will enable through intensive trainings social workers representing these 2 organisations to employ methods and principles of the model in their daily work practises. Subsequently, the enabled social workers will work more efficiently tackling street homelessness problem through their integration into society and labour market. Lessons learned will be documented and published in a format of practical guidebook for specialists working with homeless in other regional areas of Lithuania.

The practical guide prepared at the end of project implementation and widely distributed to practitioners working with homeless in other regions of Lithuania will impart them the methods tested in Lithuania that proved to be effective in homeless (re)integration and would possibly call for the need for project's replication in terms of localisation of its activities.

V. MANAGEMENT ARRANGEMENTS

The project is falling under the thematic competence (reducing social risks and social exclusion of vulnerable groups) of the Ministry of Social Security and Labour. UNDP Lithuania will act as overall responsible party for Project's implementation, while Project partners are: 1) Caritas of Vilnius Archdiocese and 2) Vilnius City Shelter. Due to specificity of funding source (European Social Fund resources), all payments for the Project will be directly processed by UNDP Lithuania (under Direct Agency Implementation modality), in line with the UNDP Programming for Results Management User Guide. UNDP Lithuania will be responsible for:

- Administration of the Project
- Project Procurement process in line with UNDP and ESF rules
- Overall quality assurance of project activities and products
- Consultancy and expert support necessary at various phases of the project implementation
- Project's publicity activities
- Ensuring that project is managed as per UNDP rules and regulations
- Ensuring reporting to ESF agency as per agreed templates.
- Knowledge management: codification of knowledge and good practices

A Project Board will be established to take responsibility for making executive management decisions for a project when guidance is required by the Project manager, including approval of project revisions. The Project Board will be comprised of the representative of UNDP Lithuania, representative of the Caritas of Vilnius Archdiocese, the representative of the Vilnius City Shelter and representative of stakeholders of the Project (to be appointed once project implementation starts). In order to ensure UNDP's ultimate accountability. Project Board decisions should be made in accordance to standards that shall ensure best value to money, fairness, integrity transparency and effective international competition. In case a consensus cannot be reached, final decision shall rest with the UNDP Programme Manager. Based on the approved annual work plan (AWP), the Project Board may review and approve project quarterly plans when required and authorizes any major deviation from these agreed quarterly plans. It is the authority that signs off the completion of each quarterly plan as well as authorizes the start of the next quarterly plan. It ensures that required resources are committed and arbitrates on any conflicts within the project or negotiates a solution to any problems between the project, European Social Fund (ESF) Agency and other external bodies. In addition, it approves the appointment and responsibilities of the Project Manager.

In addition and independently from the Project Board's role **Project Assurance role** will be important for the smooth project implementation. This will support the Project Board by carrying out objective project oversight and monitoring functions. During the Running a Project process, this role will ensure that the appropriate project management milestones are managed and completed. Head of UNDP Office in Lithuania will perform this function.
