MYA/01/005 Integrated Household Living Conditions Assessment (IHLCA) (Addendum to the Project Document)

This addendum pertains to the extension of IHLCA project duration for three additional years, i.e., 2008 to 2010.

IHLCA project will continue to use the same survey design and approach as was employed in the first survey, i.e., by implementing one qualitative survey and two rounds of quantitative surveys (one before harvest season and one after harvest season to capture seasonality). The same sampling units which were used in the first IHLCA survey (2004-2005) will be used for sample households to facilitate comparison between the two surveys. The qualitative survey will be conducted in 17 states and divisions instead of 14 states and divisions.

An additional component of the project is to estimate the Purchasing Power Parity (PPP) for Myanmar and also to compute GDP. This will provide a basis for calculating Myanmar's national poverty line, which can then be compared with the poverty lines of other countries.

This project, which is currently being executed and implemented by UNOPS, will be directly executed and implemented by UNDP in collaboration with the Ministry of National Planning and Economic Development from January 2009 on wards.

Budget and Inputs

In order to meet the anticipated costs of the above-mentioned three-year extension, the UNDP Country Office has allocated an amount of US\$ 2.3 million from its core (TRAC) resources. This amount has been allocated for project inputs as follows.
