Brief Description

In response to the security events in Rakhine since August 2017, and the consequential impacts on civilian populations, within the broader context of the protracted conflict in Rakhine state, UNDP Crisis Management Support team (CMST) has agreed to declare Myanmar a L2 status country, and to allocate funds from BPPS and CRU respectively, to urgently step up the Country Office's capacities to ensure coordination, undertake assessments, planning and consultations, design short-term and longer-term interventions, improve operational capacities, and leverage additional donor resources in order to effectively and meaningfully support national stakeholders and the people living in Rakhine state to cope with and overcome this crisis. This PIP will operationalize 6 months of support, and will lay the foundation for a second phase of programming to be undertaken by UNDP.

I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this Initiation Plan is to operationalize UNDP Myanmar's first phase of support in response to the crisis in Rakhine stemming from security events in August 2017 and its consequential impacts on civilian populations, within the broader conflict context in Rakhine State.

Through this PIP, UNDP will:

- 1. Provide immediate technical and operational support to Government of Myanmar to implement recommendations of the Rakhine Advisory Commission
- 2. Undertake necessary analytics, assessments, consultations, planning and intervention design for short-term and long-term recovery and development interventions
- 3. Improve crisis response capacities of the CO including for coordination, programme-operations management and aid effectiveness

II. EXPECTED OUTPUT (2017-2018)

Output 1:

Government of Myanmar receives immediate technical and operational support to implement recommendations of the Rakhine Advisory Commission

Building on early discussions and requests, UNDP will provide technical, secretariat and operations support to the GoM, and specifically, to the Ministry of Social Welfare, Relief and Resttlement (MSWRR), currently chairing the Implementation Committee for the Rakhine Advisory Commission (RAC). This support will include the deployment of Senior Advisor to the RAC (SURGE); the deployment of a Senior National Advisor to the RAC; technical and operational support to the RAC including, for gender advisory services, for tasks such as dafting ToRs including for RAC sub-committees; undertaking analysis and baselines including gender baselines, devising action plans and facilitaiting coordination and communication; and the articulation of UNDP's medium to longer-term support to RAC and other national institutions. When conditions are more suited, this output will also support the GoM/MSWRR to resume the Rakhine Asessment, including through the deployment of a Senior Recovery Coordinator (SURGE) and 2-3 sector specialists (SURGE). One of the key tasks of these personnel would be to ensure that conflict and gender considerations are taken on board in the implementation of RAC recommendations, as well as during the RPBA roll-out.

This activity will also support UNDP's coordination efforts around the Rakhine work stream of the Cooperation Partners Group (CPG).

- 1.1 Technical and programme resources are deployed and/or retained
- 1.2 MSWR is supported to roll-out Rakhine Joint Assessment (RPBA)
- 1.3 RAC and other national institutions receive immediate technical, operational and back-office support to undertake their functions
- 1.4 UNDP's medium to longer-term engagement with RAC and other national institutions is designed, resourced and in place

Output 2:

Key analytical and preparatory exercises are undertaken for UNDP's recovery and development programming in Rakhine state

In early to mid 2018, UNDP will implement a joint programme with UN Women, with funding support from the Government of Japan. For UNDP, the project will bring together the following intervention areas: Local governance strengthening to enhance equitable and responsive public service-delivery; strengthening the capacities of justice actors and local communities on human rights and justice access; and early recovery

and livelihoods support for vulnerable communities, and improving peace and social cohesion capacities among local actors and communities. These interventions will ensure gender sensitivity and gender responsiveness, through meaningful consultations with women and women's groups in assessments and design, targetting of women and women's groups for support in implementation and ensuring gender disaggregated data-collection, monitoring and evaluation. This project will be catalytic in initiating UNDP's substantive multi-year engagement in Rakhine State under the new Country Programme Document (CPD, 2018-2022).

Against this background, through this PIP, UNDP will initiate key consultations with union and state government, facilitate awareness-raising and sensitization workshops at state level; design and initiate key baseline assessments both overarching and sector-specific (including a Conflict Development Analysis — CDA and a Gender Protection Analysis) necessary to implement the joint programme starting in early to mid 2018. Additionally,through this PIP, UNDP will also undertake immediate measures to strengthen its capacities for coordination, programming and management of interventions in Rakhine, both at Yangon and state level. This will include the deployment of a Recovery Coordinator / Head of Sub-Office (SURGE), a Conflict Specialist (SURGE), a ROL/Social Cohesion Specialist, an Aid Coordination Specialist, an Operations Preparedness Specialist (SURGE), an Operations Manager (SURGE), an Operations Specialist, and a Programme Finance Associate. Key personnel placed under this Ouput will also be responsible for developing or elaborating on new funding proposals.

Key Activity Results

- 2.1 Conflict Development Analysis and Gender Protection Analysis for Rakhine state initiated
- 2.2 Preparatory consultations and sensitization workshops for local development planning interventions are conducted state level and in target townships
- 2.3 Consultations and sensitization workshops for the establishment of planned Rule of Law Center and related justice interventions are conducted
- 2.4 Consultations, planning, targetting and baseline exercises for planned income-generation and livelihood stabilization are conducted
- 2.5 Technical, programme and operational resources are deployed and/or retained

III. MANAGEMENT ARRANGEMENTS

Link to UNDP Country Programme: The Project will fall under the UNDP Country Programme Action Plan (CPAP 2018-2022). The CPAP comes under the oversight of a Steering Committee established to guide overall Programme implementation, which is co-chaired by UNDP and the Ministry of Planning and Finance (MoPF) and made-up of government counterparts and contributing donors and convened annually or as requested by the Chairs. The CPAP further sub-divides into 2 programmes and 6 projects. The RCRP will be established as a new PIP project within the current programme cycle and migrate to relevant programmes and project results under the new CPD in 2018.

Project Oversight: The Project Board is responsible for providing overall strategic guidance and direction to the Projec to ensure that the Project's objectives are being met. It approves the Annual Work Plan (AWP) and ensures that the required resources are committed for achievement of results, as outlined in the AWP. The Board also monitors risks associated with implementation and takes decisions accordingly. Due to the short-term nature of the Project, the Project Board will be chaired by UNDP.

Implementation arrangements: In line with the UNDP CPAP, the Project will be directly implemented (DIM) by UNDP. Under DIM, UNDP will bear full responsibility and accountability to manage the project, achieve project outputs and ensure the efficient use of funds. Acting on behalf of UNDP, the day-to-day management will be delegated to the UNDP Rakhine Project Manager. The relevant SURGE deployments will come under the management framework of this Project.

IV. MONITORING

The project will adhere to output indicators in its AWP, which will be monitored using the resources established there-in, based on an annual monitoring plan. The Project will also comply with the following, adhering to UNDP's policies:

- A quarterly progress report, on progress against pre-defined quarterly targets.
- An end-project report, on progress and results against pre-defined end-project targets.
- An issue and risk log, regularly updated.
