Description of the project:

This project is formulated to respond to the efforts of the government of Mozambique, to the recommendations of the Constitutional Council and of the different national and international organizations, to align the process of electoral administration as a strategy to improve democratic governance in the country. Previously, most of the support to the country to enhance efficiency in the electoral administration has benefited from development partners in the form of technical assistance. It is, however, becoming increasingly important to complement these efforts with an intensification of capacity development in all the arms that work on electoral process through boosting of the requisite skills and knowledge to tackle emerging issues related to effective elections and to mitigate any factors that may lead to violation of the rights of the citizens to participate in the elections. The overall objective of this project is to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of the STAE and CNE through the promotion of professionalism and ethics among electoral officers. It is to promote the fair and transparent electoral process for the planned legislative and Presidential elections in 2009.
