Description of the project:

The output of this project is the operationalization of the African Peer Review Mechanism (APRM) in Mozambique. The APRM is a self-monitoring mechanism, voluntarily acceded to by the member states of the African Union (AU), which facilitates the attainment of the objectives of the New Partnership for Africa's Development (NEPAD). By developing national capacities within key national institutions, raising the awareness about the APRM, and ensuring civil society participation in the process, the project facilitates the finalization of the first Country Review Report and the first national Programme of Action and, at the same time, establishes the organizational structures and processes needed for the APRM as an ongoing, open-ended review process with the aim of creating the conditions needed for sustainable growth and economic development in Mozambique. The project approach is based on the principles of complementarity and inclusion to ensure that the operationalization of APRM does not duplicate already existing review mechanisms and processes and to ensure that the Programme of Action becomes an operational and commonly accepted point of reference in the area of Governance in Mozambique. The year of 2010 will be for the integration of the Technical Unit into the Government structures which is considered crucial for the sustainability of the implementation of the aforementioned Programme of Action stemming from the Country Review Report. With the closure of the Technical Unit, project equipment will be disposed and re-programmed into this AWP.

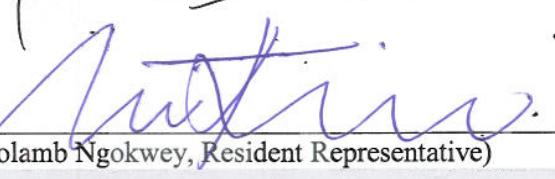
