Main questions raised for pillar 2:

what was the rehabilitation or construction? start and end date? % of execution?

What are the elements of resilience?

How many rooms/divisions?

What is the area of the land and building?

What is the function of the infrastructure/services provided?

Who are the direct and indirect beneficiaries?

2. COMMENTS (related to the objectives of the trip):

The UNDP team was accompanied by representatives of Mahlahle implementing partners while in the meetings with government institutions to a formal introduction of the partnership.

a) Provincial Secretary of Economic Activities (SPAE)

Findings:

- SPAE is very keen to invest also in activities of associations and cooperatives in the resettlement areas.
- The director is also investing much in agriculture and related activities.

b) Provincial Department of Health (DPSMAS)

Findings:

- The coordinator for Mosquito Nets activities informed that the Mosquito Net ratio is 1 net for 2 people.
- He mentioned that government is now instructing that activities should be done in the districts that people are coming back to and not in the hosting ones.
- He highlighted the importance of understanding what the kit to prevent COVID19 is composed of.

c) Instituto de Formação Profissional e Estudos Laborais Alberto Cassimo (IFPELAC)

- They presented the variety of courses they are offering at the moment.
- They shared they have limited capacity now due to the high level of demand
- They mentioned the need of training the regions with sustainability, due to lack of capacity in some areas and access to basic needs.

They introduced the provincial delegate of National Institute of Employment (INEP) with the project "My kit, my job" where they offer NFI to support the start of micro and small business.

d) Metuge (District Administration, Ngalene, Ntokota)

Findings:

- Antonio Guleiro Manganhe, the secretary of Metuge District, informed that the former population of Metuge was 101 thousand people and after the conflict over 160 thousand people arrived in the district.
- IDPs are present in Metuge since 2020, growing in numbers till now.
- Problems mentioned are lack of shelter, lack of utensils and livelihood.
- 17 centers of resettlement and 5 hosting centers were created since 2020.
- People are returning to their houses in Bilibiza (Quissanga)
- Biggest worry now is the food production. People are afraid to go to the machambas to plant because these areas are the terrorists focus.
- People are returning back from Chiure and Ancuabe, districts that hosted the Metuge people after the attacks of 2020. The return of IDPS is a major concern since this is pressuring the scarce resources of the locality.

e) Macomia (District Administration, SPDI, Attorney Office, Civil Registration, EPC Nanga, Macomia Health Center, EPC Macomia Locality 1, EPC Macomia Locality 2, Community Radio)

- The MRF projects were well received by all governmental institutions.
- The administrator of Macomia district asked for MRF intervention to rehabilitate the other administrative buildings since the SDPI building is hosting the government office, secretary of state and other executive level services.
- Attorney Office is set to start the rehabilitation on 15/12/22 and the building is in very poor condition.
- EPC Nanga is also confirmed to start the rehabilitation but still pending some technical agreements.
- Macomia Health Centre phase one is completed and other areas are yet to start.
- EPC locality 1 is yet to start and locality 2 is almost complete.
- Community Radio is also almost complete.
- Security issues in Macomia are very sensitive and the access to the district is only allowed by UNHAS.

f) Mahlahle Meeting

- Mahlahle is now trained in Community Engagement and Monitoring and Evaluation. Finance, Procurement and Communications is still to be confirmed this week.
- Mahlahle was formally introduced to all clusters (shelter, livelihood and GBV) as the implementing partners as well to the governmental institutions.

g) GDF Launching Ceremony

- The event was very successful even though governmental institutions were not able to attend due to the presidential visit
- Shelter cluster, Food Protection and Livelihood cluster and Gender Based Violence Area of Responsibility were present.
- ADIN and Provincial Secretary of Economic Activities were also present, and they shared their thoughts on the project being very glad that it will be implemented soon.

3. OTHER COMMENTS:

- Some gaps on the area of implementation must be urgently addressed.
- Visits to the pillar 2 areas, specially Quissanga now, is desired
- Constant coordination with the clusters and other governmental institution is key to the success of the project.

4. FOLLOW-UP ACTIONS:

- Discussion with key stakeholders on the definition of the areas for implementation.
- co-ordinate the existence of visibility and identification plaques at worksites
- Follow up on the issue of the Quantity of sewing machines/population in the resettled areas

- Coordinate with shelter cluster for shelter kit distribution strategy
- Coordinate with partners who have already distributed sewing machines, shelter and kitchen kits in resettlement centres
- Mahlahle need to present the strategic document for kits distribution
