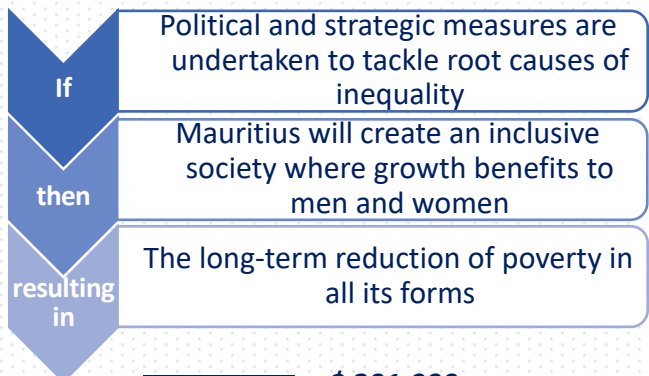
Inclusive Development and Public Sector Efficiency (IDPSE)

The project on “Inclusive Development and Public-Sector Efficiency” (IDPSE) was formulated and endorsed on 1st March 2017 as part of Pillar 1 of the UNDP Country Programme (2017-2020). The project supports the Government of Mauritius to effectively achieve equitable growth and promote an inclusive society as part of strategies to implement “Vision 2030”.



The project addresses (i) Community Development as a new approach to move from the current social assistance system to individuals, to a collective, structured and social change-led response at the local level - (ii) Challenges impeding the achievement of gender equality and equity including at the level of the legislature through assistance to the Parliamentary Gender Caucus, and towards eliminating gender based violence at the national level; (iii) Transformation in public sector.

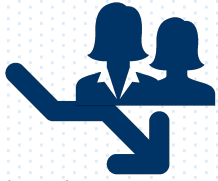

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OBJECTIVE

The project seeks to support the Government of Mauritius to effectively achieve equitable growth and promote an inclusive society as part of “Vision 2030” implementation.



IMPLEMENTATION

This project is nationally implemented by Government of Mauritius in partnership with UNDP.



KEY RESULTS

- Assistance to the implementation some of the 39 costed and actionable proposals of the Marshall Plan to fight against poverty. This plan proposes a social inclusion framework anchored in human rights, to assist with the integration of the vulnerable segments of the population into the social, political and economic life of the nation;
- UNDP deployed a National Gender Expert to support in operationalization of the caucus and building the capacity of Members of Parliament and sectoral Gender Focal Points on gender mainstreaming strategies and gender sensitive monitoring and evaluation;
- Capacity Building of Senior Officials within the civil service as part of the Public Sector Business Transformational Strategy of Government.
