The Access to Justice Program started in 2008, to enhance the coordination of the justice sector, under the common view that access to justice can be dramatically improved if the justice sector is developed through a programme based approach to coordinate assistance based on the desired impact rather than assisting individual institutions such as courts, prisons, or paralegal services. The institutional arrangements to manage the sector wide justice programme are under discussion and the institutions that will constitute the coordinate mechanism in the administration of justice have been involved through participative stakeholder meetings at policy and technical levels.

The Democratic Governance Sector Working Group will be maintained as one of the sixteen sector working groups for Malawi and will clearly be defined into two Sub Sectors- the Justice Sub Sector and the Democratic Accountability Sub Sector- based on the interrelated operational mandates between institutions and to facilitate sector wide dialogue. These two sub sectors and all nineteen institutions are aggregated under the Democratic Governance Sector and will be sub clustered in view of their contributing roles and operational mandates.

An important component in this programme is to facilitate the policy framework and strategic planning for the whole Democratic Governance Sector. The Technical Specialist for Justice has successfully facilitated the process jointly with Government through justice stakeholders meetings. Institutions that will constitute the coordinated mechanism in the administration of justice have been involved through a participative approach at policy and technical levels. The Democratic Accountability Subsector, led by the office of the Ombudsman is supported by a Technical Specialist who will facilitate the coordination and founding of the sub sector and kick start first activities on Accountability and Transparency. The overall SWAp arrangement will be coordinated by an international SWAP manager placed in the PPU in MoJ to support the Sector Secretariat. A component on indicator development and M&E framework is integrated in the work plan and supported by the Global Program and Oslo Governance Centre.

The program will be implemented by the Ministry of Justice that will be responsible for the implementation of all activities in this AWP, monitor and provide monthly financial reports and quarterly progress reports to UNDP. Following the implementation of Harmonized Approach to Cash Transfer (HACT) modalities, advances will be disbursed directly to the implementing partner on a quarterly basis upon receipt of a satisfactory progress report.
