### Brief Description

The Social Cohesion project is designed to support the Government of Malawi in its endeavour to establish a National Peace Architecture (NPA) that will provide a platform for collaborative dialogue, peace building and conflict prevention. This is in line with the constitutional provision, section 13(l), which calls for the "adoption of mechanisms for peaceful settlement of conflicts through, among other strategies; conciliation, and mediation to ensure that the country is secure and democratically mature". Building on all the support rendered to the Government of Malawi in this area since 2012, which has among others resulted in key stakeholder acceptance and buy-in, as well as a Report for the establishment of a NPA in Malawi, UNDP will in 2015 continue to support the processes toward the establishment of this national mechanism. The AWP will focus on supporting the creation of a conducive policy environment and legal framework for the establishment of the NPA, and this will be through; finalization of the Strategic Plan and draft Policy; Drafting the NPA Bill; and the piloting of the NPA structures in 3 districts. This AWP will also continue to support initiatives aimed at increasing the participation of youth and women, particularly young women and women, in conflict prevention initiatives.
