Narrative

The new National Disaster Risk Management (NDRM) policy is the guiding document on DRM and lists the main priorities of the Government of Malawi (GoM) on disaster preparedness, mitigation, response and recovery. Following from this, multi-sector preparedness planning and response capacity will be developed at national, district and community levels to reduce disaster risks and shocks to vulnerable people. Specifically, the following are the main pillars of the Project Support Document (PSD): Mainstreaming disaster risk reduction into sustainable development policies and planning processes at all levels of government; Establishment of an effective system to identify, assess and monitor disaster risks under data, information and knowledge systems, including early warning systems (EWS's); and strengthening coordination at all levels. The Malawi DRM system is in a transition phase from a disaster management-reactive approach to a more comprehensive and proactive disaster risk management approach. Although progress has been made to establish supporting strategic frameworks and institutional mechanisms, several needs and challenges remain, in order to assist the Government of Malawi on key issues of disaster risk management aimed to reduce damage and losses caused by disasters. The main deliverables for 2016 include, but are not limited to: finalization of the review of the National Disaster Preparedness and Relief Act, operationalization of the small grants scheme; implementation of the National DRM Policy, development of DRR mainstreaming guidelines, implementation of the National DRM Communication Strategy; capacity building , simulation exercises; and finalization of the disaggregated DRM database. The 2016 will also see the up-scaling of the SGS Community Based DRR projects with funding from UNDP China.

Implementation of the suggested activities will be done in collaboration with relevant partners who are undertaking similar activities. For instance, finalization of DRM plans for cities will be done in collaboration with UN Habitat. Similarly, the SGS Community Based DRR projects will be implemented in collaboration with officers who are responsible for the Malawi Floods Emergency Recovery Project to avoid jubilation of efforts.
