Brief Description

At the request of the Economic Planning Unit (EPU) and in line with para 4.2 of the Country Programme Action Plan, the project will support the development of the 11th Malaysia Plan: 2016-2020 (11MP). Specifically, through this umbrella project, UNDP will provide technical and policy advisory support through its direct engagement in the 11MP's Inter-Agency Planning Groups and Technical Working Groups and support the preparation of relevant Strategy Papers as inputs into the 11MP; organize related National Consultations and Focus Group Discussions around core issues to be addressed by the Plan; and organize relevant capacity building of EPU and line ministries as required in the preparation of the 11MP Report. The project's priority will be to strengthen the evidence base, analysis, design and prioritization of the medium to long term strategies and enable inclusive and sustainable national development policies and implementation programmes to be formulated and prioritized through the 11MP.

SITUATION ANALYSIS

1. Introduction

The Government of Malaysia will embark upon its 11th Malaysia Plan for 2016-2020 (11MP), which is scheduled to be presented to the Parliament prior to the public launch. The preparatory work for the 11MP commenced with the Circular from the Chief Secretary of the Government to all Ministries and agencies on 29 October 2013. The 11MP will form the last phase of the 5 year development plans for the country to achieve its aspirations of an advanced and high income economy by 2020.

To achieve this development aspiration, the framework of the 11MP encompasses 6 thrusts:

Thrust 1: Re-engineering economic growth

Thrust 2: Strengthening growth enablers

Thrust 3: Harnessing talent

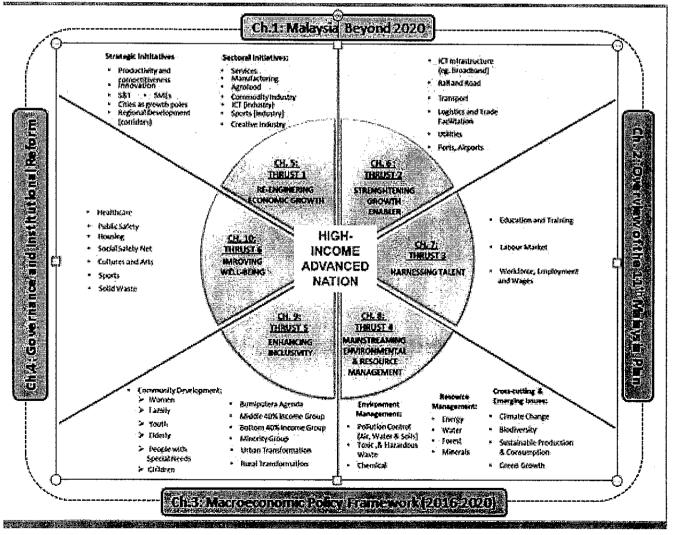
Thrust 4: Mainstreaming environment and resources management

Thrust 5: Enhancing inclusivity

Thrust 6: Improving well-being

The 11MP document will comprise of 2 public documents, the *Main Document* and relevant *Strategy Papers* for the 6 Thrusts. The *Main Document* will outline the overarching policies and strategies in the 11MP, aimed at accelerating transformation, whereas the *Strategy Papers* will provide the details of policies, strategies and programmes outlined in the *Main Document*. In line with this, the Government have established Inter-Agency Planning Groups (IAPG) and Technical Working Groups (TWGs) for the respective Thrusts.

The framework of the 11MP is outlined below.



2. UNDP's Previous Support to Government of Malaysia's 5 Year Development Plans

UNDP Malaysia's engagement with the Government on the 5 year plans dates back to the *First Malaysia Plan: 1966-1970*, where it supported the Government of Malaysia in the implementation of its 5 year development plan by providing technical assistance with a focus on strengthening the institutional and organisational frameworks and enhancing the institutional capacities of the Malaysian public service through customised and focused training and workshops.

Since the beginning of the 10th Malaysia Plan: 2011-2015 (10MP), all projects implemented or under implementation by UNDP Malaysia's have been selected, designed and operationalised with EPU and key Ministries with the specific purpose of assessing the success and implementation challenges of the previous 5 year development plans; supporting the analysis, design and monitoring of the 10MP, and to be forward looking by generating specific concrete policy recommendations and options for review and consideration in the 11MP. In addition, policy analysis and recommendations generated for EPU and Ministries were also contextualised by international and regional best practices and trends, as well as Malaysia's international commitments under various conventions that Malaysia has signed and ratified.

II. STRATEGY

2.1 Overview

In line with the Country Programme Action Plan 2013-2015 signed with the Government of Malaysia, through this project, UNDP will provide technical and policy advisory support to strengthen the analysis, design and prioritization of the medium to long term strategies and to enable inclusive and sustainable national development policies to be formulated and prioritized through the 11th Malaysia Plan: 2016-2020. In addition, the project will seek to strengthen the institutional capacities of senior policymakers by organising international policy dialogues for global benchmarking and trends analysis, as well as national capacity building and advocacy workshops for the teams in EPU and line ministries supporting the preparation of the 11MP.

2.2 UNDP's Technical Team

UNDP's technical and institutional support for the preparation and the development of the 11MP will build and leverage upon the UNDP Malaysia's national programme portfolio and its strong policy engagement with EPU, ministries, State Economic Planning Units, academia, private sector and civil society organisations.

In addition, UNDP Malaysia will also complement its country team with UNDP policy advisors, technical experts, and specialists in the UNDP Asia Pacific Regional Centre based in Bangkok, UNDP Global Centre for Public Service Excellence_based in Singapore and UNDP Bureau for Development Policy based in New York to guarantee both breadth and depth of scope in its support to EPU in the preparation and the development of the 11MP.

2.3 UNDP's Engagement with the IAPG and TWG

As of February 2014, UNDP has been invited as members of the following Thrusts:

- Thrust 4: Mainstreaming environment and resources management: Member of IAPG and 4 TWGs;
- Thrust 5: Enhancing inclusivity: Member of IAPG and TWG (Inclusive Growth);
- Thrust 6: Improving well-being: Member of TWG (Housing);
- Chapter 4: Governance and Institutional Reform: Member of TWG (Rationalization of the Public Sector).

2.4 Thematic Focus of UNDP's Institutional Support for the Development of 11MP

In line with the thematic scope outlined in the Country Programme Action Plan 2013-2015, UNDP's technical and policy advisory support will be focused primarily on the following thematic areas and objectives:

1) Enhancing Inclusive Growth

To enable the national development agenda to systematically move towards an inclusive socio-economic development paradigm and improve the livelihoods of the bottom 40% of households, UNDP's technical assistance and policy development support will seek to provide support in sustaining and scaling up national achievements in mainstreaming the human rights-based approach to development and gender equality in the 11MP by providing inputs on:

- Mainstreaming inclusive growth considerations in macro-planning frameworks, socio-economic models and policies to address the needs of the bottom 40% and middle 40% of the income group including vulnerable groups in urban settings;
- 2. Addressing socio-economic imbalances (with a focus on Sabah, Sarawak), and the needs of marginalized and disadvantaged populations (including Orang Asli in Peninsula Malaysia and persons with disabilities);
- 3. Empowering and advancing women's socio-economic progress:
- 4. Improving well-being, which encompasses all aspects of life including access to good-quality economic opportunities, education, infrastructure, housing, and health;
- 5. Improving institutional arrangements for innovative and inclusive outcome-based monitoring and evaluation frameworks.

2) Mainstreaming environment and resources management

To support the national development priority of establishing a climate resilient growth strategy and ensuring the equitable and sustainable use of environmental resources, UNDP's technical assistance will seek to contribute to the 11MP by providing inputs on:

- Ensuring integrated biodiversity and climate change management, conservation and sustainable utilization of natural resources address the needs of women, indigenous and local communities, and poor and vulnerable groups and are in line with the global Aichi targets on biodiversity, United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change and United Nations Conference on Sustainable Development;
- 2) Addressing the impacts of climate change, with the aim of achieving sustainable development by establishing stronger linkages to the critical science and policy interface;
- 3) Strengthening the poverty-environment nexus in national policies;
- 4) Increasing use of renewable energy and strengthening the implementation of energy efficient practices;
- 5) Strengthening the existing framework on sustainable financing options for widespread green technology application through the low carbon cities initiatives and the effective management of biodiversity;
- 6) Strengthening national resilience in reducing risks of disasters through systemic organisational planning.

2.5 Project Outputs and Activities

The project will have four key Outputs and they are as follows:

Output 1: Support to 11th Malaysia Plan's Inter-Agency Planning Groups (IAPG) and Technical Working Groups (TWGs)

Based on UNDP Malaysia's project portfolio from 2008-2014, UNDP's Technical Team will provide policy advisory services and support to the IAPG and TWG in fulfilling the tasks in its respective Term of Reference.

The findings, analysis and policy recommendations from the UNDP Malaysia projects portfolio (2008-2014), especially from a human development perspective and drawing on global and regional experiences, will form the core foundation of UNDP's technical support to the IAPGs and TWGs in identifying the issues, policies, strategies and programmes in the 11MP.

In addition, to strengthen evidence-based policy making, where required, the development and utilisation of relevant macro and sectoral models, scenario-planning analysis, comparative regional/global analysis as well as new statistical indicators and measures relevant to Malaysia's status as a Middle Income Country will be developed.

Throughout the process of engagement as outlined above, UNDP will extend a range of policy models as well as concrete policy recommendations and options emanating from UNDP Malaysia's project outputs which are derived from baseline data (including Geographical Information Systems mapping); targeted community perception surveys nationwide; thematic stakeholder dialogues with civil society organizations; and policy dialogues across Ministries and agencies and global benchmarking.

Output 2: Support to Preparation of 11th Malaysia Plan's Strategy Papers

In line with the needs of the IAPG and TWG for *Strategy Papers*, at the request of EPU, UNDP will support the engagement of national/international experts and work jointly with the appointed experts in the analysis and development of the required *Strategy Papers* and ensuring a strong foundation of inclusive and sustainable human development approaches are applied and provided. In addition, dedicated technical 'write-shops' and close-door workshops will be organised to further refine the preparation of the *Strategy Papers* and to obtain feedback on the proposed policies, strategies and programmatic approaches in the 11MP.

Output 3: Benchmarking International Best Practices and Trends

Leveraging upon UNDP's global network of policy experiences and high-level global experts, UNDP in close collaboration with EPU will organise a series of closed-door and public seminars for senior policymakers on thematic areas relevant to the 11MP. Emphasis will be placed on identifying, codifying and analysing the relevant regional and global best practices, trends and lessons learned and challenge in similar upper middle income economies from around the world (namely from Asia, Europe, Latin America, and Oceania). UNDP through its policy network will engage internationally renowned development thinkers, academics and senior policy practitioners to share their perspectives on the global and regional trends.

Output 4: Capacity Building and Institutional Strengthening

In the final preparatory phase of the development of the 11MP Report, UNDP will design a customised training and capacities building workshop for selected staff of EPU with the aim of enhancing writing skills and visual presentation of development oriented information and enhance the advocacy of the key messages of the 11MP. The format and approach of the support will build upon the *Technical Writing Workshop* organised by UNDP Malaysia in September 2011 for 40 EPU staff on enhancing writing skills especially in preparation of policy reports, documents and other national and international development oriented publications.
