## NIGER STATE

### Background

Niger State, one of the 36 states of Nigeria was created out of the defunct North Western State on 3<sup>rd</sup> February 1976. Situated in the North Central geo-political zone, Niger State shares its borders with the Republic of Benin (West), Zamfara State (North), Kebbi (North-West), Kogi (South), Kwara (South West), Kaduna (North-East) and the FCT (South-East). The State comprises 25 Local Governments Areas grouped into 3 administrative zones: A, B, C with each zone having 8, 9 and 8 Local Government Areas (LGAs) respectively. With the merger of Borgu Emirate from old Kwara in August 1991, Niger State is one of the largest states in Nigeria covering about 86,000km<sup>2</sup> (or about 8.6million hectares) representing about 9.3% of the total land area of the Country.

The easily identifiable major ethnic groups are Nupes, Hausa, Gbagyi, Kadara, Koro, Bassa, Kamuku, Ingwai, Fangu, Kambari, Dukkawa, Fulani, Abewa, Bisan, Gungawa, Bauchi, Bariba, Urah, Boko, Bokobaro, Bauchnu, Achisawa, Dakarkari, Kakanda, Ganagana, and Dibo (26 in all) and numerous non native tribes.

The major economic activity in the State is agriculture:- farming, fishing, and cattle rearing. The other economic activities (though limited in scale) include banking, trading, transportation, local arts and crafts with Bida, the heart land of the Nupes, famous for its brass work. These activities constitute the means of livelihood of the people of Niger State in addition to public service engagement.

### Key Developmental Challenges:

Niger State faces major development challenges characteristic of States with weak economies and low income: pervasive poverty, ever increasing societal inequality and gender inequity; there remain issues of ensuring equity and access, maintaining standards and quality, inadequate investment in infrastructural development, inadequate and poor teacher quality, motivation and development, ineffective planning and management, low private sector involvement at all levels; Inadequate health care infrastructure and shortage facilities; unacceptable level of HIV/AIDS prevalence limited HTH coverage; and weak public institutions with attendant corruption and mismanagement of resources, high cost of government procurements; unemployment and

weakening value system are leaving the youths in a state of despair; rising trend in drug abuse, juvenile delinquency, stealing and general youth restiveness; Conflicts assuming alarming dimensions. Niger State's remain very vulnerable to climate change, given the irregular rain patterns, perennial and often devastating flooding. Because our people live on forest resources and other weak practices, the State loss of forest cover annually is rapid.

### **Lessons Learnt from 2013 Implementation**

1. The UNDP Country Programme support to Niger State between 2013 focused on sound and effective strategic development planning and fiscal management (MTSS); laying the foundation for efficient management and coordination of partners; Consolidating on the gains of the State fiscal and procurement Law and strengthening procurement governance at State and LGA levels are key to achieving sustainable success; the operational capacities of the Micro-finance institutions and the Coordinating Agency needs to be strengthened for effectiveness and to be able to lay the basis for Wealth Creation and Empowerment of the Poor through product development and export; and reducing State Vulnerability to climate change while promoting Sustainable Environmental Management.
2. The painstaking process of developing the MTSS in three (3) sectors of Health, Education, and Agriculture greatly built the capacity of the Staff to lead the process in other sectors; The Collection and collation of data for the compilation of the 2012 State MDGR really showed that a lot still needs to be done in the area of data management and retrieval; even though the State Statistical Year Book (SYB) template has been produced & reviewed by stakeholders for general understanding and application and timely data production there remains the work of training and retraining of staff on the instrument; the State capacity to manage Aid efficiently is hinged on a strengthened aid architecture that is reinforced for effectiveness.
3. To State's capacity to respond and manage her climate change vulnerabilities should be built on a sound sectoral planning and a well coordinated intervention. The support to Niger State Disaster Management Agency and State Ministry for Environment, parks, Gardens and Forest Resources showed that to provide immediate emergency response to communities in line with the State Disaster and Risk Reduction framework requires inter-sectoral approach; putting in place early warning systems is very important in achieving effective response system as outlined in the DRR framework;
4. The 2013 programme implementation also brought to the fore keys areas for improvement and consolidation for the state to address emerging; deepening support for Fiscal and procurement governance at both State and local government levels while focusing on operational issues for systems sustainability; shifting emphasis from addressing all the issues in the MDGs to focusing on the weakest links; inclusive market development and growth for accelerated poverty reduction and incomes generation; strengthening State's capacity for results based M&E, knowledge sharing and data

management across all sectors; addressing youth restiveness through effective youth engagement schemes and entrepreneurship development programmes.

### **Emerging Priorities for 2014**

- Governance : entrenching procurement system at sub-national level; institutionalizing cadre rank; building understanding of policy makers in procurement and anti-corruption; effective coordination for the attainment of MDGs; encouraging CSOs participation in Social Budgeting and Auditing.
- Crisis Prevention:
- Economic Development: Building policy understanding on MDGs report and accelerated framework for progress; strengthening Aid Coordination through Partnership desks and DAD; building state capacity to implement MTSS and the results based M&E framework; strengthening fiscal management, coordination and reporting; Accurate, timely and reliable statistical data generation and management.
- HIV/AIDS governance and advocating and campaigning on stigmatization and allied issues.
- Environment/Sustainable Development: providing legal framework for implementing DRR in the state; strengthening State emergency preparedness to response to Environmental risks; building capacity on early warning Systems through Communities; and through dialogue on Climate Change, building understanding of practitioners and critical stakeholders on the realities of Climate Change vulnerabilities and responses.
- Private Sector and Youth Employment generation: promoting inclusive Entrepreneurship development across the value chain; enhancing the management and operations of Small and Medium Enterprises for effectiveness; strengthening MFI-MIS at the State level; laying a sustainable basis for the growth and Development of Commodity markets.

### **Implementation Arrangements and Monitoring**

- The subsisting UNDP programme implementation Guideline applies. Statutory Government Agencies retain the roles of implementing the programmes as designed by them. The Ministries will provide the supervisory function. The State Planning Commission and the Outcome Secretariat will work jointly on the monitoring and Evaluation of the activities as indicated on the workplans.
