Geographical: Gombe state is located in the North-East geo-political zone of Nigeria. It was carved out of former Bauchi state on October 1st 1996. The state has a landmass of 20,260 square kilometers located between latitude 9° 30' and 12° 30' North and longitude 80° 45' and 110° 45' East. The population of Gombe state is estimated at 2,599,427 in 2009 (GSSYB). Females and Males constitute 47.4% and 52.6% of the population respectively. Men and Women of reproductive age (MWRA) constitute 44.8% and young people (10-29 years) form 39.9% of the state population. The state is divided into three geopolitical zones (North, South and Central). These zones are further divided into eleven local Government Areas.

Political: Gombe state was created on 1st October, 1996 and had 2 different Military Governors before 1999, where there is successive transfer of power from Military to 1st democratically elected Governor; by 2011 it has its third civilian Governor. The state has 11 LGA's namely: Akko, Balanga, Billiri, Dukku, Funakaye, Gombe, Kaltungo, Kwami, Nafada, Shongom and Yamaltu-Deba.

Socio-Economic Characteristics: Gombe state is multi-ethnic comprising Hausa, Fulani and Tangale amongst many ethnic groups. Inherent in these ethnic groups are cultural festivities like Pissi of Tangale, Chigotte of Cham, Dambang of pero-filiya, Yilin of Dadiya , The Tera Dance that enhance the Socio-economic bound of the people. The predominant religions are Islam and Christianity.

Eighty percent of the population are peasant farmers with a substantial number of mobile herdmen (Fulanis). The state has identified solid minerals deposits in all the LGA's.
