

A Regional Dialogue Event concerning land issue in Bharatpur, Chitwan



On 6th of January 2016, the Regional Field Office (RFO), Bharatpur, Chitwan organized a dialogue event to discuss land issue regarding the rights of women and highlight the positive provision in new constitution to nurture women's meaningful

ownership. The event aimed to create a fruitful platform for constructive dialogue about the issue and tried to generate ideas to address them in regional level. Therefore, directly concerned stakeholder were invited from four districts of central region including Bara, Parsa, Chitwan and Nawalparasi.

The event was marked with participation of government authorities such as the Chief District Officer (CDO), Local Development Officer (LDO), Superintendent of Police (SP), Head of women and Child Office, head of Inter Party Women Alliance (IPWA), political leaders, head of Regional Alliance of women Rights Activist, N-peace leaders, President of Federation of Dalit Women Organization, NLRF, NEFIN and wide range of professional organizations who works to address land issue.

The program initiated with short background of CPP and W4W regarding land. After that, a paper presentation regarding the current issues of land and how does it has connection with women rights by president of National Land Rights Forum (NLRF) Mr. Lyam BDR Darji.

After his presentation, the floor was open for comments, feedbacks and opinion concerning the issue. During this session, there were lively discussion about women rights in relation to land issue, why land rights are important for, and how to practically promote women ownership in land. As the participants were women leaders, concerned stakeholders, senior professionals, they meaningfully participated in the dialogue and seriously focused with



discussion. They contributed their input and shared their vision during the opinion session and apreciated CPP's cooperation for the event. They also expressed their motivation to initiate similar dialogue in other parts of the region and they voluntarily formed a regional land dialogue forum.
