(1) Summary of the project

The project aims at improving the quality of life and health conditions through developing and improving water supply services and facilities in both Rafah and Northern Governorates in the Gaza Strip. The project will also serve residents of the poor camps, suburbs and rural areas surrounding the city of Rafah.

Overall, the Project will improve the overall management of the water system facilities in the Rafah Governorate. For the Northern Governorate, the project will develop and improve the capacity of current water facilities for the municipalities of Beit Hanoun.

i. Special notes or comments

- ➤ On 1 June 2011, EoJ approved modification and budget reallocation of the project.
- On December 20, 2011, Mr. Nakamura Hitoshi from the Representative Office of Japan to PA visited Beit Hanoun and the locations of the two tanks, booster pumps and few well that need rehabilitation and reconfiguration.
- On June 25, 2012, a meeting was held between the Japanese Representative to PA and CoGat official in Tel Aviv where CoGat's approval on Beit Hanoun water supply and network was granted
- After receiving CoGat approval for Beit Hanoun components in June 2012, UNDP/PAPP conducted price market surveys in relation to the issued tenders in 2011 for Beit Hanoun and assessed the capacity of the winner contractors and their willingness to execute the contracts as well. As a result, UNDP/PAPP team decided to proceed and to sign the contracts, three contractors agreed and signed the respective contracts. However, the winner contractor of the eastern storage tank bid didn't accept to sign the contract. So, UNDP/PAPP re advertised the tender of the eastern tank of Beit Hanoun.
- ➤ The coordination for bringing the construction materials requested for Beit Hanoun western tank, wells and trunk lines started within the fourth week of September 2012. It should be noted that there is a gap between signing the contracts for Beit Hanoun components and the actual starting dates. Commencement letter is issued by UNDP after getting the construction material into Gaza. This is a preventive measure adapted by UNDP to reduce potential claims that might be submitted due to delay in entering construction material.
- After completion the construction and the operation of Rafah water tank and booster pumps, 50% of Rafah inhabitants (about 100,000 persons) have better access to municipal water supply. This message was published as a success story in UNDP Development Advocate. The success story was among the best twelve stories submitted by 66 UNDP country offices worldwide and selected by a twelve-member jury that included representatives of the Permanent Missions of Australia and Canada to the UN, and prominent print and broadcast international journalists, many of whom focus on development stories.
- The insulation materials request for the construction of Beit Hanoun two water tanks was issued on 22.7.2013 and the materials were partially received on 28.11.2013 which leads to a significant delay in the implementation.

- ➤ On 24 March 2014, RoJ approved the extension of the project till 30 June 2014. UNDP will submit the narrative completion report in July 2014 and the final financial report by the end of year 2014.
- ➤ On 17 February 2014, Ms. Helen Clark, UNDP Administrator, Mr. Junya Masuura, Ambassador for the Palestinian Authority RoJ to PA, and Eng. Rebhi El-Sheikh, Deputy Head of PWA, inaugurated the "Construction of Storage Tank ST 25 and Booster Pumping Station" project in Beit Hanoun. The heads of UN agencies in Gaza, Beit Hanoun Municipality and community participated in the ceremony. Over 45,000 inhabitants (42,000 people in Beit Hanoun and over 2,500 people in the nearby Um Al Nasser area) will have access to good quality water service after the project is completed.



UNDP Administrator visits Programme of Assistance to the Palestinian People 19 Feb 2014

United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) Administrator Helen Clark wrapped up a two day visit to the occupied Palestinian territories today which focused on development priorities there and how UNDP could support them.

During her visit, Helen Clark met with Prime Minister Rami Hamdallah and other senior ministers to discuss their development priorities, with UNDP staff, and with Palestinian civil society organizations.

She also visited UNDP projects, including one that <u>assists female entrepreneurs</u>, a <u>water system project in Gaza</u>, and a <u>cultural tourism project near Jericho</u>.

Water Project in the Gaza Strip

95% of the water extracted in Gaza is unsuitable for human consumption, forcing the majority of the population to purchase desalinated water. This is a result of the water table's sustainable yield being over extracted, putting its future viability at risk. Compounding this issue, the sewage network has collapsed, leading to widespread discharge of sewage in the area which has contaminated the aquifer.

To help address this issue, Helen Clark inaugurated a new UNDP - supported water system that creates new water networks and supply services to ensure good quality water is available for a local neighborhood. This project, supported by Japan, will improve the quality of life and health conditions of Gaza's residents

UNDP has completed more than 200 water supply and sanitation projects in the West Bank and Gaza Strip. Projects ranged from strengthening water and sanitation authorities to the construction of water supply and distribution networks, storage reservoirs and house connections.

UNDP's Programme of Assistance to the Palestinian People, also known as PAPP, derives its mandate from the UN General Assembly Resolution 33/147 of 20 December 1978. UNDP was requested "to improve the economic and social conditions of the Palestinian people by identifying their social and economic needs and by establishing concrete projects to that end".

مقدمة

يعتبر الوضع الحالي لمياه الشرب في قطاع غزة متدنياً جداً بالمقارنة مع الحد الأدنى للمقاييس الدولية المطلوبة للحفاظ على الصحة العامة من حيث الكمية والنوعية، فقد بلغ معدّل استهلاك الفرد الواحد في اليوم 90 لتر في العام 2011م في حين أن متوسط الحد الأدنى الموصى به من منظمة الصحة العالمية هو 150 لتر في اليوم و بلغت نسبة التلوث الكيماوي في كميات المياه المستخرجة من الخزان الجوفي أكثر من 90% بأملاح الكلورايد والنترات. يعتبر إنشاء مشاريع خزانات المياه والمضخّات وخطوط النقل والتوزيع الرئيسية ضمانة لتوزيع المياه بشكل عادل لجميع مواطنى القطاع.

Background

The current status of drinking water supply in the Gaza Strip is well below acceptable international standards for the protection of public health (minimum standard 150 l/ c/ d). The annual per capita consumption in the Gaza Strip reached 95 l/ c/ d in 2011. More than 90% of the supplied water is chemically contaminated with chlorides and nitrate.

Construction of water tanks, boosters, main carriers and networks are considered the main basis for equitable water distribution for Gaza citizens.

Project description

On 19 November 2006, the United Nation Development Programme / Programme Assistant to the Palestinian People (UNDP/PAPP) and the Palestinian Water Authority (PWA) signed a standard letter of agreement through which UNDP/PAPP will execute the "Emergency Water Supply and Rehabilitation Programme" project with funds from the Government of Japan for the amount of USD 5,424,107. The project consists of two packages: Rafah component and Beit Hanoun component.

انشاء الخزان الغربي

يعتبر الخزان الغربي (ST-25) ذو الشكل الدائري وسعة اجمالية تقدر ب 4000 متر مكعب واحدا من أهم مكونات المشروع في مرحلته الأولى، و يعتبر ايضا خزانا ارضيا سيخدم محافظة بيت حانون وأجزاء من قرية أم النصر.

انشاء شبكة مياه و خطوط ناقلة

حيث تم تركيب واستبدال أنابيب قديمة، وتركيب خطوط ناقلة جديدة بحيث تربط بين الآبار التي تم تأهيلها من ضمن المشروع وخزانات المياه الجديدة.

اعادة تأهيل الابار المغذية للخزانين

ان الهدف الرئيسي لاعادة تأهيل الآبار الموجودة مسبقا هو لحماية طبقة المياه الجوفية من الاستنزاف من خلال تقليل الحد الأقصى لإنتاج الآبار ل 100 متر مكعب في الساعة. كما وتهدف ايضا الى اعادة تأهيل مخطط امدادات الآبار من خلال منع الضخ المباشر للشبكة وتحويل المياه الى الخزانات عبر الخطوط الناقلة. وقد تم تحقيق ما سبق عن طريق اعادة تحجيم قدرة الضخ لخمس مضخات آبار بالاضافة الى استبدال محركات المضخات و الامدادات الكهربائية والميكانيكية.

انشاء خزان المياه و محطة الضخ في بئر خديجة بالاضافة الى حفر بئر جديد

حيث تم انشاء خزان مياه ارضى بسعة 3.000 متر مكعب ومضخة مياه ، بالاضافة الى انشاء بئر مياه جديد ومبنى خدمات. هذا وسيتم ربط الخزان والمضخة والبئر بالشبكات الجديدة المغذية لبيت حانون.

Beit Hanoun Packages

New Storage Tank ST-25

One of the main components of the project is the Storage Tank (ST-25) - Phase I with a circular shape and total capacity of 4000 m³. The ST-25 ground storage tank will serve Beit Hanoun locality and some parts of Um EL Nasser.

Water Network

The available works included the installation of new pipes, pipes replacement and new trunk lines from the existing wells in order to be re-configured to the water tanks.

Reconfiguration of Existing Wells

The main purpose of reconfiguring the existing water wells is to protect the aquifer from depletion by limiting the maximum production rate of the wells to 100 m³/hr. and reconfigure the supply schemes from the wells by preventing the direct pumping into the network and diverting all of the supplied water via trunk lines to the storage tanks. This was translated into resizing five wells' pumping capacity and the power of the pumps' motors and the electrical and mechanical installations.

Construction of Khadeja Storage Tank , Khadeja Well and Booster Pumping station

This component consists of the construction of 3000 cubic meters ground water storage tank with the construction of a booster pump. The works also included the construction of anew water well and service building. The tank, booster pump and water well will be connected to the new networks.
