#### Brief description

Eleven (11) littoral countries participated in the first regional programme<sup>1</sup>, and they were joined by Japan, during the second regional programme. The two regional programmes have helped to develop methodologies and policies for the integrated management of coastal and marine areas of the Seas of East Asia. The Seas of East Asia are composed of six large marine ecosystems, namely the South China Sea, East China Sea, Yellow Sea, Sulu-Celebes Seas, Indonesian Seas, and the Gulf of Thailand. 
