#### **UNDAF/** expected CP Outcomes:

By 2017, the Autonomous Bougainville Government (ABG) leads post-conflict recovery and development planning and budgeting and provides a safe, secure, stable, and sustainable environment in which girls, boys, women and men enjoy their rights to equitable access and utilisation of basic services and their protection from violence, discrimination, exploitation, injustice and inequality.

#### **UNDAF Outputs:**

- By 2017 the relationship and trust between GoPNG and ABG are strengthened with a view to effective implementation of
  autonomy arrangements and of the Bougainville Peace Agreement. ABG, Private Sector and Communities have increased
  capacity to promote inclusive socio-economic recovery and Development through sustainable resource management

#### **Brief Description**

Through this project, UNDP supports the Autonomous Bougainville Government (ABG) in applying effective crisis management and prevention policies, strategies and techniques. As such, UNDP's priority support is targeted at the implementation of the Bougainville Peace and Security Strategy, at both the upstream policy level and the downstream implementation level, through strengthening the capacities of ABG divisions, regional institutions and civil society in democratic governance, rule of law, promotion and protection of human rights and gender equality and women's empowerment. Support at the Bougainville regional level are complemented by local level interventions in Bougainville, as well as national-level interventions in support of peacebuilding and crisis risk management in Bougainville, including strengthened collaboration between ABG and the Department of Prime Minister and National Executive Council as well as the National Coordination Office for Bougainville Affairs (NCOBA). The commencement of initiatives under the Peacebuilding Fund will enhance the programme and support specific work in line with the proposed referendum. There are three strategic areas which UNDP will provide support which are trust building between both governments, awareness on the referendum and addressing gender-based violence prevention through dealing with trauma healing, community security and governance.
