General Objective:

The general objective of the project is to enhance capacity of the Ministry of Justice to develop the new medium term National Anti-Corruption Strategy by availing the UNDP's international experience in the field and its capacity of "neutral broker" in engaging all stakeholders' in the policy development processes.

Justification:

Considering the in-house expertise on anti-corruption within the MoJ and other public institutions concerned, and attempting to encourage national ownership of the strategy elaboration process, the UNDP will limit its involvement to the facilitation of the "stakeholders engagement meetings" targeted to defining the priorities of the new AC strategy and to conducting a needs assessment exercise with a comparative analysis approach.

Implementation and Management Arrangements:

The project will be nationally implemented by the Ministry of Justice. The UNDP will assign the Programme Manager a.i. (Governance Portfolio) to manage the project on behalf of UNDP. UNDP will provide implementation support services to the MoJ in contracting the consultants for an ISS fee of 1% of the project proceeds.
