Brief Narrative Description:

This project document is pursuant to the CPAP 2010-2012 agreed to between the Government of Romania and UNDP and operationalizes the CPAP through detailed description of activities. The project will develop the Social Economy (SE) concept in Romania and implement a set of activities that will increase the awareness among targeted vulnerable groups and the general population. More specifically the target groups will be Roma, women and post institutionalised children. This task will be approached through three objectives: Accumulating SE expertise by conducting analyses of the social and economic context for SE in Romania and setting up institutions specialised in SE; Training human resources in SE and developing a postgraduate curriculum in SE practices; and; Promoting the SE concept and its benefits, stressing its potential to facilitate the social inclusion and the employment of vulnerable groups. The project is implemented by the Alternative Sociale Association who is the lead applicant under the funding mechanism of the Sectoral Operational Program for Human Resources Development as referred to in the CPAP. UNDP will provide implementation support services to the lead applicant through capacity development for the delivery of the outputs and activities described in this document.

AAS will receive the funds pertaining to the implementation of this project and will distribute the funds to each partner for the implementation of the agreed activities.

UNDP will receive from AAS the amount of **1,865,115.73 USD** for the implementation of the activities that were assigned to UNDP and also for meeting the costs of the project coordination. Distinct project accounts will be opened for this project's funds.

The legal context of this project is the Standard Basic Agreement between the UN and Government of Romania (1991)

This document together with the CPAP signed by the Government and UNDP which is incorporated by reference constitute together a Project Document as referred to in the Standard Basic Assistance Agreement and all CPAP provisions apply to this document.

Consistent with the Article III of the Standard Basic Assistance Agreement, the responsibility for the safety and security of the implementing partner and its personnel and property, and of UNDP's property in the implementing partner's custody, rests with the implementing partner.

The implementing partner shall:

- a) Put in place an appropriate security plan and maintain the security plan, taking into account the security situation in the country where the project is being carried;
