Situation Analysis:

King Abdul Aziz City for Science and Technology is working towards establishing a national Open Source Software (OSS) center that will act as a single point of reference on OSS focusing on coordinating and facilitating development and implementation of OSS for the public sector in Saudi Arabia.

The decision concerning the establishment of such a center came from the concerns regarding propriety software. These include issues of licensing fees, security vulnerabilities and possible vendor lock-in. Partially for these reasons, KACST decided to encourage the development and localization of open source software in the Kingdom several years ago.

Since 2000, among other things, KACST has worked on a project for Linux Arabization. It has produced an Arabic e-mail client and editor for Linux users. Following these projects, KACST has carried out several OSS projects through which it contributed to the Arabization and localization of several international OSS products such as K Desktop Environment (KDE), OpenOffice and Fedora. KACST has also developed open source fonts for Linux.

KACST is currently developing an Arabic spell-checker and Math editor for OpenOffice. As part of its efforts in the OSS localization in the Kingdom, KACST is also working on Arabizing educational OSS for children.

Objective, outcomes, duration of the Preparatory Assistance (PA)

The objectives this PA is to carry on a mission that will assess the current situation and prepare a report on the feasibility of a National OSS Center or perhaps even an "Open ICT Technologies Center" that would focus not only on OSS but also open Information and Communication Technologies (ICT) ecosystems. In Addition, this PA will facilitate the development of a project document that would encompass main activities and outcomes for a joint development programme between KACST and UNDP.

This PA will provide two international consultants in the field of OSS for the duration of seven man/days.

The report will include the potential benefits of OSS and open ICT ecosystems for Saudi Arabia. If the findings and conclusions of the mission are positive, the report will also include possible initiatives and projects that could be undertaken, as well as guidelines and references based on the experience of other OSS established resource centers.

The main outcomes, outputs and activates that are intended to serve this purpose are represented in the following:

Outcome 1:

The establishment of the Saudi National Open Source Software Center (OSS).

Output1:

A feasibility study report, providing an overview of benefits of OSS and open ICT ecosystems; the feasibility of a resource center; plans on advocacy research, and development work the center could undertake

Activities:

- Propose guidelines and references for assessment based on the experience of other, established OSS resource centers in Asia and beyond
- Assess the desirability and feasibility of the establishment of a national resource center to undertake advocacy nationally, as well as research and develop activities towards achieving benefits of open ICT ecosystems and/or OSS
- Propose possible plans on research initiatives and activities that the proposed center could undertake
- Assess the human, financial and materiel resources that the proposed center would require over the short (1 year) and medium-terms (3 years) in order to deliver on its proposed program of work
- Identify regional and international programs and initiatives that the proposed center should establish links with for mutual benefit
- Prepare a presentation to stakeholders on the preliminary findings

Output2:

An agreed upon project document including work plan and budget for the KACST

Activities:

- Based on output one and initial feedback, Draft an initial logical framework and project document.
- Drafting of detailed work plan and budget will be developed to express the needed resources to be mobilized to support UNDP activities, and preparation of project document for signing.
