I. PURPOSE AND EXPECTED OUTPUT

As part of the signed Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between the Oversight and Anti-Corruption Authority (Nazaha) and the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) on the 10th of September 2019, which aims at providing a framework for cooperation between the two parties; the UNDP will provide technical support to Nazaha by providing support to Nazaha to assist on specific projects with the overall objective of strengthening international cooperation on preventing and combating corruption. This will indeed promote justice and assist in building effective, accountable, and inclusive institutions, in line with SDGs16.

In proceeding with this assignment, both parties will be adherent to Article VI¹ as stated under the signed MOU.

The focus of this initiation plan will be on supporting Nazaha to organize the first Anti-Corruption Ministerial Meeting of the States Parties to the Organization of Islamic Cooperation. Such support will include:

- a) Assisting Nazaha in implementing its proposal and on the drafting of a Ministerial Communique for States Parties to the Organization of Islamic Cooperation.
- b) Supporting Nazaha on other related tasks in agreement with UNDP.

The support will also extend to ensuring Saudi Arabia's national legal framework effectively complies and allows for the implementation of the Convention on Combating Bribery of Foreign Public Officials in International Business Transactions, of the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD).

Furthermore, the initiation plan may include other tasks as requested by Nazaha. This may include:

- Reviewing the developed Implementation Review Mechanism of the Arab Convention against Corruption, ensuring it is in-line with best international practices on review mechanisms.
- Conducting capacity building programs in the areas of the expertise of the UNDP Senior Anti-Corruption expert.

II. MANAGEMENT ARRANGEMENTS

The project management structure includes a main body of consultation and decision, the Project Board. It also includes a level of daily management, implementation and monitoring through the project manager and a technical and administrative unit.

Article VI:

The Parties are bound to use the information and documents exchanged between them only for their intended purposes, as agreed. Said information and documents will not be transferred to any third party or be used for administrative, editorial or judicial purposes without the written consent of the party who supplied said information and documents.

The provisions of this Memorandum concerning the confidentiality of the shared information will remain in force, even after the termination or expiration of the Memorandum.

The Project board will be set up to supervise the implementation of the project. It will involve the representatives of the technical and financial partners contributing to the project. The project board will be co-chaired by UNDP and Nazaha. The project board, at the request of Nazaha, may replace at any time any UNDP appointed Senior Anti-Corruption expert working for Nazaha's project.

The project will follow a National Implementation Modality (NIM). This entails one of the two following arrangements: 1) Direct Payment and 2) Support Services. In both cases, payments are made from the UNDP bank account, but in direct payments, the government assumes responsibility for the contracting process, performs recruitment or procurement, and signs the contract according to its own rules and regulations. UNDP assumes this responsibility for support services, based on UNDP rules and regulations. The arrangement can be decided upon by the Project Board and it will be implemented consistently across all project cycle.

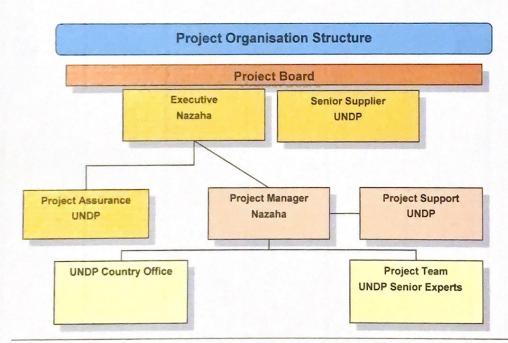
