The Solomon Islands Democratic Coalition for Change Government (SIDCCG) has a vision to ensure that all Solomon Islanders live and co-exist in a peaceful environment where national Unity continues to be nurtured and thrive.

Additionally, the Solomon Islands Democratic Coalition for Change Government is serious in its effort to continue the journey of nation-building and peace by protecting human dignity through providing an enabling environment to stimulate and nurture economic growth in Solomon Islands.

Ladies and gentlemen, as Minster responsible for National Unity, Reconciliation and Peace, on behalf of the Government wish to express my gratitude to all Government Agencies, UNDP and UNWomen for stepping forward not only to initiate but also to make the commitment to implement this project.

On that same note, I am also grateful to the UN Peacebuilding Fund for their generous support in this project. Your support is a manifestation of your value for peace, human dignity and the peaceful co-existence of Solomon Islanders and visitors alike.
