Brief Description

Prior to the Covid-19 pandemic, the Serbian Government decided to pursue digitalization and education as the most important catalysts of innovations, competitiveness, and growth. To drive this agenda forward, the government drew an ambitious plan related to digital transformation of the administration, economy, and society. Part of this plan was to establish the national IT retraining programme, to address the growing need for qualified labour in Serbia's booming IT sector. Apart from skilled IT professionals, Serbia also needs digitally literate citizens that can participate in and benefit from the increasingly digital economy, government, and society.

UNDP has been collaborating with Government of the Republic of Serbia (hereinafter referred to as "the Government") of Serbia in designing and running the national IT retraining program since 2017. Over the previous three years, 1,250 individuals in 8 different cities have gone through educational programs, enabling them to code in different programming languages and gain the status of junior programmers. Another 220 participants across Serbia are currently going through a completely online program, adapted to the Covid-19 context. Encouraged by good results and equipped with lessons learned from the previous rounds of the IT retraining program, the Government/ Ministry of Labour, Employment, Veteran and Social Affairs and UNDP aim to continue implementation of the program in 2022 and beyond, within the scope of this project. Additionally, given the relevance of digital literacy and bridging the digital divide, this program also plans a pilot digital literacy program for seniors living in retirement homes. Moreover, a new cycle of the IT retraining programme will be delivered by seven training providers in 2022 and 2023 for over 360 participants.
