This is to request for a budget revision for the Thailand Policy Lab (Project No. 00130905, Output No. 00124098) for budget year 2021.

The Thailand Policy Lab, which is a partnership between UNDP and the Royal Thai Government through the Office of National Economic and Social Development Council (NESDC) was initiated in November 2020 to introduce an innovative approach to policy-making and public service delivery in Thailand, at which time a budget was approved and set up in ATLAS for a total of USD 3,000,000. Of this total, USD 1,149,999 was allocated and approved in ATLAS for implementation in 2021 as per the Project Initiation Plan. Following on-boarding of the Thailand Policy Lab management team in April 2021, a Project Steering Committee meeting was held on 7 June 2021 to review the Thailand Policy Lab's workplan and operational budget for 2021. From that meeting, the project Steering Committee endorsed a budget of USD 780,705 for implementation of the 2021 workplan.

The Thailand Policy Lab's workplan endorsed by the Sterring Committee in June 2021 was then revisited in early September 2021 given the continued situation with COVID19. Many of the activities originally planned for "on-site" implementation under Output 2: national capacities for policy innovation in Thailand accelerated and Output 3: community of policy innovator in Thailand established, had to be rearranged to "online" thereby reducing the logistic costs for these activities quite significantly. In addition, following continous discussion with NESDC, it became increasingly apparent that a few interventions under Output 1: innovative policy at regional and national level ideated and prototyped, would require a lengthier timeline to realize given the complexities of the methods and the nature of policy making processes. Also, the recruitment of the project management associate took longer than expected since the candidate selected for the position declined the offer after the initial recrutiment concluded during the second quarter of 2021. This resulted in a slight reduction in the budget previously allocated for Output 4: project management.

Under these circumstances, the budget allocted for certain activities under each output, including that allocated for the program management unit, following the revisiting of the budget in early September 2021 is expected to reduce by approximately 16.5 percent from the budget of USD 780,705 as endorsed by the project Steering Committee in June 2021, to approximately USD 650,000. The remaining budget originally allocated for 2021 will be repositioned to 2022. (Note that a Project Document is being developed for the Thailand Policy Lab Project, which will allow extension of the budget to 2023 as per the duration of the partnership agreement between UNDP and NESDC, at which time a 2022 budget revision will be requested following approval of the Project Document.)

The table below summarizes the budget that was approved and set up in ATLAS in December 2020 and the budget revision being requested for 2021 following the revisitation of the Project workplan in September 2021, and the budget being repositioned to 2022. The requested revision also includes an addition of two Implementing Agents (IA) namely the Chiangmai University School of Public Policy and University of Payao, School of Political and Social Science under Outputs 1 and 3. Chiang Mai University School of Public Policy will be allocated up to USD 140,000 (USD 100,000 under Output 1 and USD 40,000 USD under Output 3) to design an innovative policy framework and bring together well-known experts to share knowledge and experience with a community of public innovators. University of Payao will be allocated up to USD 39,000 (USD 5,000 under Output 3 and USD 34,000 under Output 1) to raise awareness of the importance of policy innovation and design policy packages for personalized social welfare.

The remaining budget previously allocated for 2021 will be repositioned to 2022, ensuing a total for 2022 of USD 2,350,000 (from USD 1,185,000). #### 1. Welcoming Remarks

- Mr. Suriyon Thunkijjanukij and Mr. Renaud Meyer gave a welcoming remark to open the meeting for the first Thailand Policy Lab (TPLab) Steering Committee Meeting.
- Mr. Meyer mentioned that the TPLab would be playing an important role in rethinking how the
  government and development sectors address issues from new and different angles. He also stated
  that together with NESDC, this partnership could bring together national partners in policy
  making, thereby making the TPLab a leader in innovative policy making.
- Mr. Thunkijjanukij thanked Mr. Meyer for reminding him about the background of the TPLab and the overview objective on "what" and "how" the TPLab could help and represent new ways of policy making in Thailand and beyond.

#### 2. Adoption of Agenda

• Both co-chairs, Mr. Suriyon and Mr. Renaud adopted the agenda of the meeting.

#### 3. Introducing of TPLab Management Team

• Mr. Thunkijjanukij invited participants to introduce themselves, beginning with the TPLab management team, the UNDP team, the Accelerator Lab team and the NESDC team.

#### 4. TPLab Work Plan and Operational Budget

• Mr. Thunkijjanukijn invited Ms. Nitasmai Ransaeva, Head of TPLab and colleagues to present the work plan and programme budget for financial year 2021- 2022.

#### Background of the TPLab

- Today's issues are becoming more complex and interconnected, and traditional approaches for designing and formulating policies are no longer sufficiently agile, efficient and effective.
   Instead, these challenges call for interdisciplinary approaches and non-linear solutions, tapping into local insights and greater participation from different stakeholders.
- To accelerate innovation in public policy services, the Royal Thai Government, through the NESDC and UNDP, have partnered and established the Thailand Policy Lab (TP Lab)
- TPLab's vision is to become "the Leading center for policy Innovation" with a mission "to innovate Thailand's public policymaking for greater efficiency, effectiveness and responsiveness to new challenges and people's needs". With these sets of ambitious vision and mission, the TP Lab has further established its five anchored objectives of the Lab are:
  - a) To foster inclusive and citizen-driven policymaking
  - b) To innovate policymaking processes for tackling contemporary and future challenges
  - c) To enhance capacities of the public and private sectors to design and implement innovative policies
  - d) To build a multi-level sustainable network of policy innovators
  - e) To promote Thailand as the leading regional hub for policy innovation
- Governance Structure of TPLab the Steering Committee, which is co-chaired by UNDP and NESDC is responsible for providing strategic direction and strategic decisions and monitoring progress. In addition to the Steering Committee there is also an advisory board, comprising of representatives from UNDP, NESDC, other government agencies, academia, civil society organizations and the private sector, which will be responsible for providing advice and consultations to the TP Lab. In addition to the advisory board, there is another arm to the Steering Committee, which comprises of the UNDP expert teams. In terms of management arrangement UNDP will manage and take responsibility for the implementation of activities in the workplan in line with UNDP rules and regulations



#### • 2021 Operational Plan and Budget

- In order to achieve the TP Lab's five core objectives and aspiring vision, TP Lab has grounded the foundation of its work (or the cornerstone of work) around the policy making process and innovate it and re-design public service delivery. The first part of the cornerstone of work focuses on the policy making process. However, in order to accelerate the impact of innovation in public policy and services, there has to be other enabling factors that exist simultaneously. The TP Lab categorizes these enabling factors into four different areas: virtual policy platform, community of innovator, capacity building and communication and engagement.
- Introduction of the 6 components of the work plan
  - Component 1: "Policy innovation" which is the process that produces responsive, effective and efficient policies that address contemporary challenges.
  - Component 2: "Youth Policy Innovation" which increases the engagement of youth in developing public policy and in the public policy processes.
  - O Component 3: "Virtual Platform" that will serve the diverse front of the policy innovation processes.
  - Component 4: "Community of Innovators" that aims to strengthen the policy innovators network and promote the exchange of ideas, lessons learned and best practices around policy innovation and innovative policy making processes.
  - Component 5: "Capacity Building in Innovation" which is to build the capacities of policy planners and key stakeholders in policy innovation for more effective implementation of innovative policies.
  - Component 6: "Communication and Public Engagement" which aims to increase and sustain the public's interest and engagement in policy issues and the TP Lab's activities as well as generate knowledge on innovative policy approaches and methodologies.
- In terms of partnership, TPLab will tap into various resources within UNDP (in Thailand, at the regional and global level) to support the TP Lab team with implementation of the activities. These internal resources included the Accelerator Lab, the UNDP Regional Innovation Center (RIC), UNDP Youth team, Gender Advisor, Regional Advisors in various sectoral areas (digital transformation, governance, youth, etc.) UNDP Global Network, such as the Oslo Governance Network, the Singapore Global Centre for Technology, the Innovation and Sustainable Development, the Istanbul International Centre for Private Sector in Development and the Seoul Policy Centre.
- In addition to internal resources, the TP Lab team has also started to connect with and reached out to other potential partners from public and private sectors, academia, civil society organizations and the media. For example, Thailand Institute of Justice (TIJ), Youth in Charge (YIC), Chulalongkorn University (CU), Thailand Future Foundation (TFF), and The Standard.
- UNDP Thailand has thus far received an allocation of 2,000,000 USD from NESDC since September 2020 (1,150,000 USD in 2020 and 850,000 USD in 2021). UNDP is providing inkind contribution.

#### • Way forward

- TP Lab will accelerate implementation across all activities per established timeline.
- TP Lab will continue to engage with existing partners and discuss specific actions and reach out to new partners who have the potential to support with implementation.
- Establish and implement communication and engagement process according to communication strategy.

#### **Comments and Discussion:**

 Mr. Meyer suggested that the TP Lab produces a list of identified partners for each activity and component. He mentioned that some potential partners have not been identified or indicated for each component. For example, National Innovation Agency (NIA) and Digital Economy Promotion



- Agency (DEPA). He also raised that the implementation timeline of the activities would be very tight and the pace of implementation would be challenging, but he remain excited to see how they progress.
- Ms. Lovita Ramguttee added that the TP Lab Program Associate who is not yet on-board would be playing an important role on administrative work once the position is fill and the UNDP Transactional Service Team would also be providing crucial financial, procurement and HR support.
- Mr. Thunkijjanukij mentioned that "youth Engagement in policy making process" is the main priority for TPLab. However, the TP Lab would need to find the right partners. He was keen to see how UNDP's procurement process could accommodate partnership with YIC.
- For the Training the Trainers (particularly university lecturers), Mr. Thunkijjanukij suggested that the TP Lab would need to assist the lecturers in developing a curriculum to transfer knowledge from the training program(s) to the students. Therefore, the expected outcome of this activity is not only about the lecturers being trained, but also institutionalizing the new sets of knowledge and tools into universities' curriculum(s).
- Mr. Thunkijjanukij requested that UNDP's in-kind contribution be added to each component (on the slide). He mentioned that this addition would be important to NESDC when presenting the work to the executives or the Parliament.
- Ms. Ramguttee commented that it would be useful to have an annex with the detail work plan in the Excel file separated from the slide presentation when presenting to the Parliament so as to keep information on the slide presentation concise.

#### **Conclusion:**

- The Steering Committee endorsed the TPLab work plan and operational budget for fiscal year 2021-2022 (revised slide presentation and TP Lab work plan attached.)
- The Steering Committee approved the procurement of equipment as specified in the workplan and transfer of the full title and ownership of assets/equipment to NESDC at any time during its lifetime. The transfer of title is limited to the use of such assets for the stated purposes of the Project.

#### 5. Other Matters

- With regards to the monitoring process, the meeting has agreed that the Steering Committee would meet once per 4-6 months depending on the situation. However, the coordinating level (Mr. Thunkijjanukij and Ms. Ramguttee) should meet once per month. For the working level (TP Lab management team and NESDC), a meeting once per week was preferred.
- For the members of the advisory board, Ms. Ramguttee suggested that UNDP and NESDC should discuss further on the specific members of the Advisory Board and it could be necessary to develop TORs for the Advisory Board.
- Mr. Thunkijjanukij requested that in each next meeting with NESDC the TP Lab should present a one-page monitoring list for the meeting in order for the team to track the progress of each activity.
- Regarding the launch of the lab, Ms. Ramguttee suggested that the TP Lab should seek for feedback from the public during the pre-launch to gather public's opinion on how they view the TPLab and their expectations. For instance, the TP Lab could conduct a survey on the four themes that people are most interested in during June-October that could be presented during the prelaunch.
- Mr. Thunkijjanukij informed that in September, NESDC would be organizing it annual meeting (mostly on the 13<sup>th</sup> National Plan) and advised that the official launch of the TP Lab should take into consideration the timing of NESDC's annual meeting. It is possible to further explore if and how TP Lab would contribute to NESDC's annual meeting.

• Mr. Thunkijjanukij concluded that meeting endorsed the TP Lab's work plan and instructed the TPLab team to accelerate implementation and deliver. He mentioned that perhaps they would be able to join the next meeting. Lastly, he thanked all of the participants who participated in this meeting.
